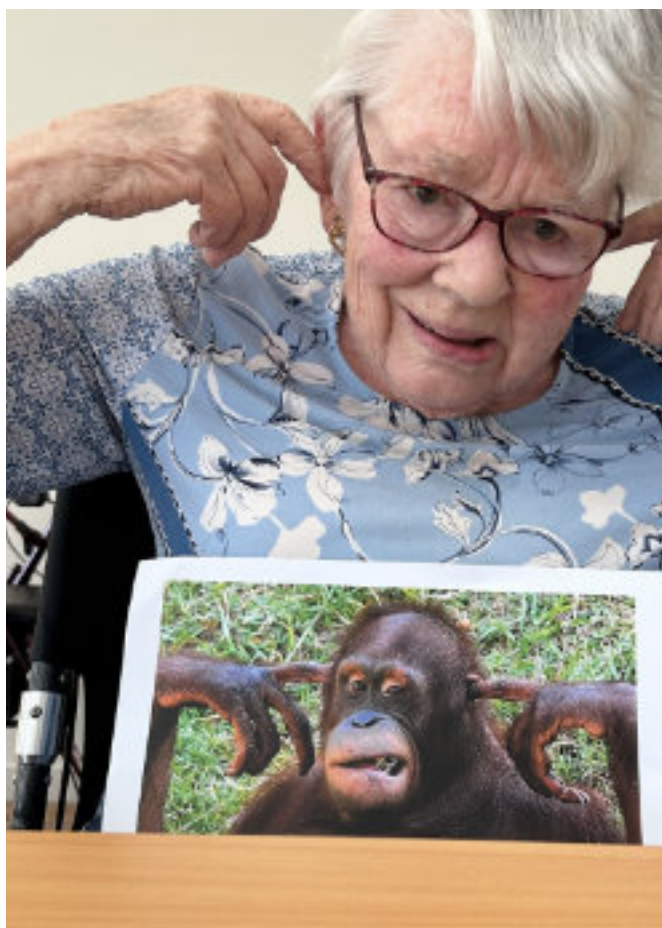
APRIL FOOLS

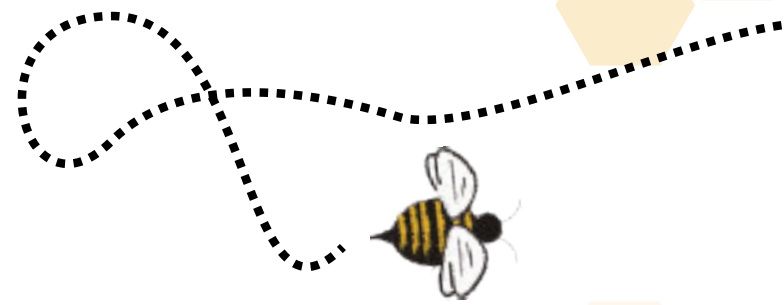

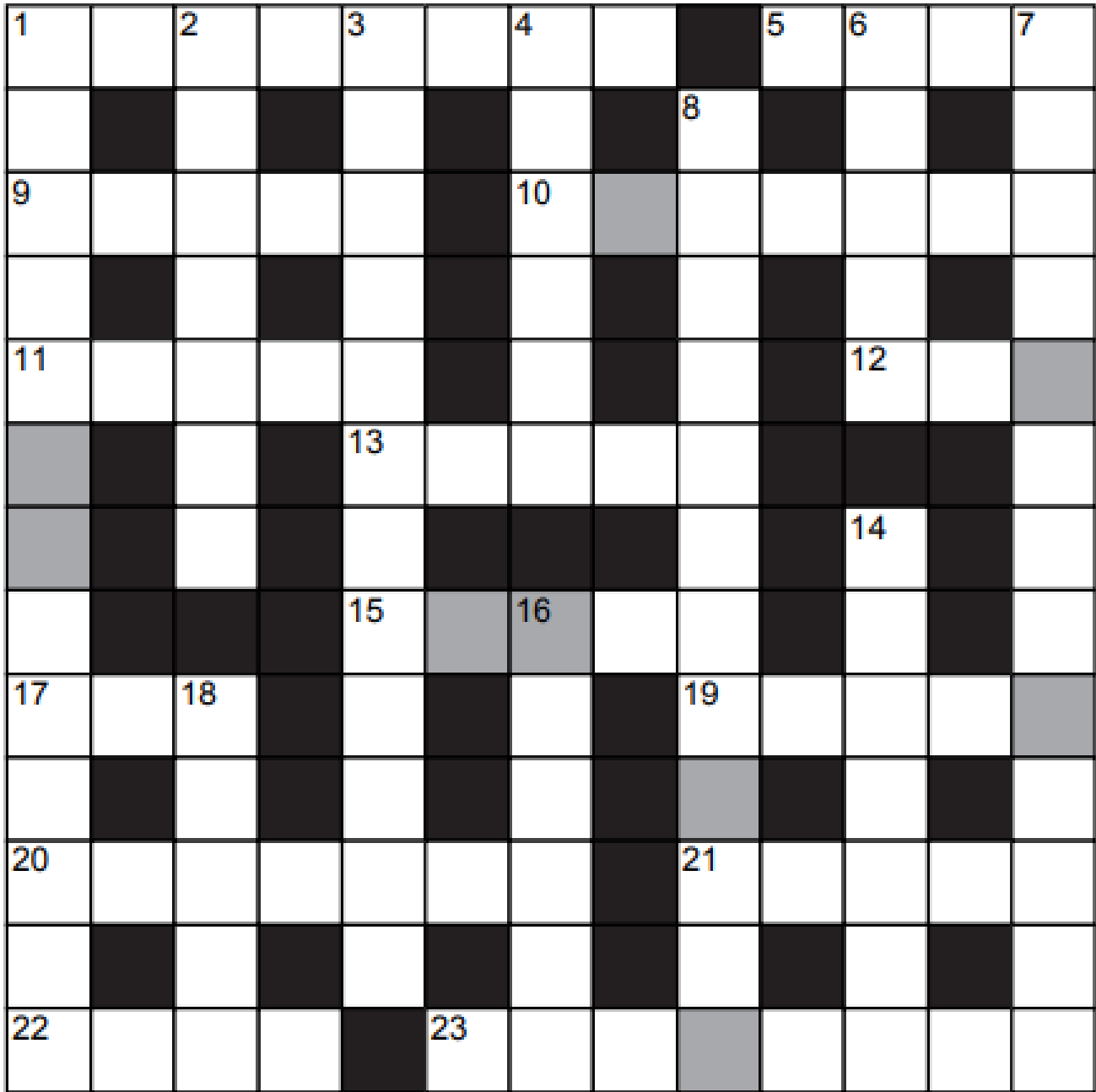

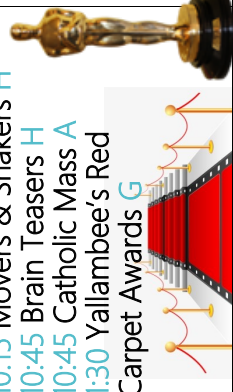
