



THE INVINCIBLES, THE ARSENAL.

In late 1886, a gaggle of workers from the Woolwich Arsenal Armament Factory decided to form a football team. They called themselves Dial Square as a reference to the sundial atop the entrance to the factory. That small football team became one of the best teams in modern football. Now the Arsenal have gone invincible in their 2003-2004 season. They were led by manager Arsene Wenger and relied on two key players, Dennis Bergkamp and Thierry Henry. Arsenal's top goalscorer for the third year running was Thierry Henry, who scored 39 goals in 51 games. The Frenchman was given the accolade of PFA Players' Player of the Year by his fellow peers and the FWA Footballer of the Year by football writers. With Dutchman Dennis Bergkamp providing a substantial impact in aiding in Henry's goal scoring proficiency.
