Personal Reflection:

Nothing in this life would make sense unless we allow it to grow roots & beautifully bloom. We all faced hardships which can seem unfair - like failing a test we had put so much work into, receiving rejections for the love we sincerely gave, getting scammed for providing online sadaqah or being badly perceived when we were being honest & calling others to the truth. What a betrayal, and where is the justice? Life didn't make sense to me before, and, I had asked, "Isn't Allah SWT with the one who only wishes for good in this world?".

As I continued wayfaring through, turbulence upon turbulence, I glanced back. Now, thousands of nautical miles from when I started my journey in my mother's womb in a foreign country, **I saw past turbulences no longer as hardships; they were the roots, I am the plant, and life is now the garden of ease I get to enjoy - Alhamdulillah!** There were lessons in every rejection, failure, and loss. And of course, in hindsight, I now realise that the Quran & contemplations are light, water & the fertilisers needed for my growth!

But time and time again, I remind myself of the words of grown-up Prophet Yusuf AS (paraphrased): **"Al-Latif is always kind to me."**

This is a true promise binding on Him in the Torah, the Gospel, and the Quran. And whose promise is truer than Allah's? So rejoice in the exchange you have made with Him. That is 'truly' the ultimate triumph.

'It is the believers' who repent, who are devoted to worship, who praise 'their Lord', who fast, who bow down and prostrate themselves, who encourage good and forbid evil, and who observe the limits set by Allah. And give good news to the believers.

(At-Tawbah 9:111-112)

Personal Reflection:

In Surah At-Tawbah 9:111, Allah describes the ultimate transaction — Allah’s “Business Deal”! A deal between the Creator and His servants—but who benefits more? Allah doesn’t need anything from us, yet He offers us Jannah in return for what He already gave us. This is not a loss; **it’s an honor to be chosen for His cause.**

Then comes a question that shakes the heart: **“And who is truer to His promise than Allah?”**

No one fulfills promises like Allah SWT. When He has promised Jannah, it is guaranteed!

And right in the next ayah (9:112), Allah SWT describes those who uphold this transaction:

- **At-Taibun:** Those who repent
- **Al-’Abidun:** Those who worship
- **Al-Hamidun:** Those who praise Allah
- **As-Saaihun:** Those who travel/strive for Allah’s cause
- **Ar-Raki’un:** Those who bow in ruku’
- **As-Sajidun:** Those who prostrate in sujud
- **Al-Amiruna bil-ma’ruf, wan-nahuna ’anil-munkar:** Those who enjoin good & forbid evil
- **Al-Hafizuna li-hududillah:** Those who observe Allah’s limits

These qualities aren’t just for a select few—**they are a roadmap for all of us.**

Personal Reflection:

I exist in this world only by the permission of Allah. He sent me here not to walk alone, but to lean on Him, to trust Him with every step I take. Yet, despite knowing this, when hardships strike, I find myself pleading with Him to make things go my way, assuming I know what's best for me, forgetting the simple truth that Allah SWT, in His infinite Wisdom, sees what I cannot. Every person I encounter, every blessing I receive, and every trial I endure carries a lesson, a hidden mercy that may not be clear to me now, but is always part of His love and greater plan; His way of shaping me, protecting me, and guiding me home.

When I finally reach a place of true acceptance, when I can whisper to my heart, "It's okay, it's Allah", Alhamdulillah, my heart finds its peace, **not in the certainty of my plans, but in the certainty of His.**

Since my favourite word in the Quran is Protector, I find myself relying on this du'a as a shield in my daily life: ***O Allah, conceal my faults and calm my fears.*** There are moments both big and small, that stir fear within me. For example, when I drive to work and see a lawnmower, I worry that a stray stone might crack my window. When I submit my work, I fear it may not meet expectations. When I am simply being myself, I wonder if those around me will accept me as I am.

But in these moments of vulnerability, **this du'a becomes my protector.** I recite it each morning - if the day goes well, Alhamdulillah, and if challenges arise, Alhamdulillah still, placing my trust in Allah SWT, knowing that whatever unfolds is only by His decree.

Personal Reflection:

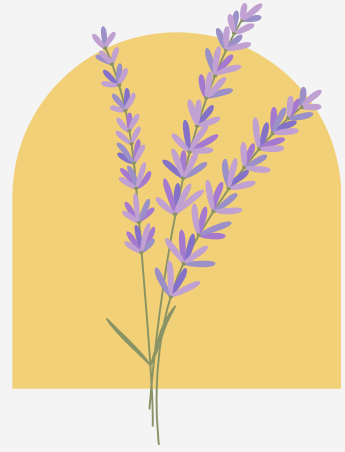

Personal Reflection:

I've always wished for a strong bond with my brothers. Growing up, we often got into big fights over small things, and my ego often made it hard for me to be the one to apologize. Usually, it was our parents who had to step in and force us to make peace.

I used to look at others who shared close, caring relationships with their siblings—those who called, checked in, and genuinely cared—and wondered why my relationship with mine wasn't like that. For the longest time, I thought it was impossible to change the dynamic between us, until I came across this Ayah that shifted my perspective.

Allah tells us about Prophet Musa (AS) and how he once became angry with his brother Harun (AS). Ayah 7:150 describes Musa's frustration, both in his words and action. Yet, Harun did not respond with anger or defensiveness. Instead, he chose to explain kindly, appeal to brotherhood and empathy and remind his brother not to make their enemy rejoice by appearing divided. In the next Ayah, **even though Musa was still angry, he did not forget to include his brother in his du'a, asking Allah for forgiveness and mercy for both of them.**

This story taught me that it is normal to have disagreements and conflicts within the family. I realised my brothers and I share similar traits (our tempers, egos, and reluctance to back down). Although I can't change how my brothers behave, **I can change myself.** I can choose to respond with softness over anger, patience over pride, and forgiveness over resentment. And the first step is including them in my sincere duas (even if I am in conflict with them). It's not easy, but it's a step toward building the bond I've always longed for.

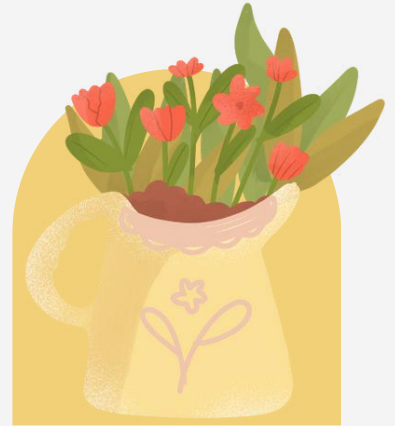
