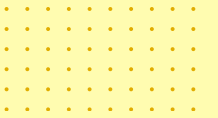

What Are Internal Hemorrhoids?

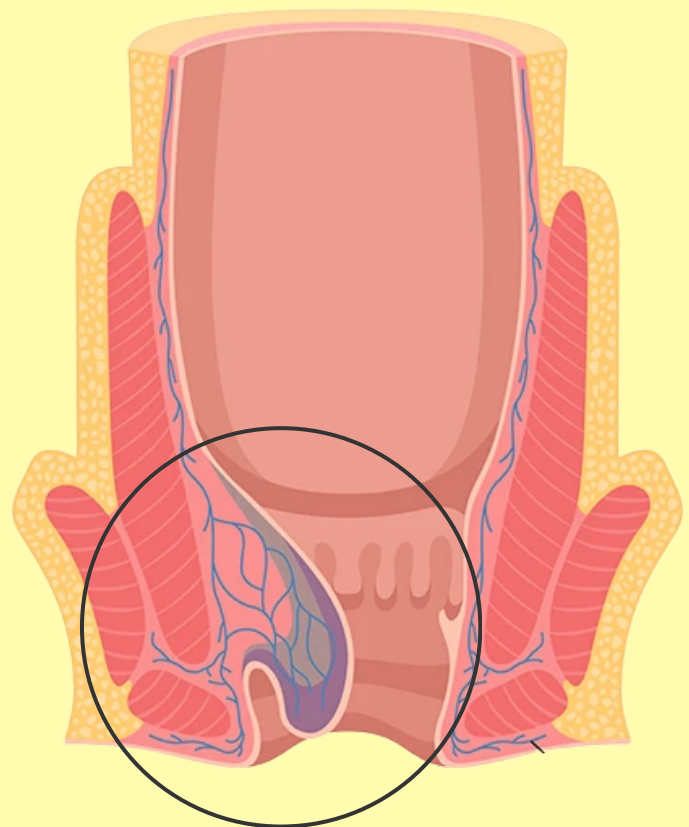
Internal hemorrhoids are swollen blood vessels located inside the rectum. They are a common condition and can cause symptoms ranging from mild discomfort to persistent bleeding.

How Can Internal Hemorrhoids Affect You?

Bleeding: May cause bright red blood during or after bowel movements.

Enlargement: Can lead to prolapse or tissue that protrudes from the anus.

Irritation: May cause discomfort, mucus discharge, or difficulty with hygiene.

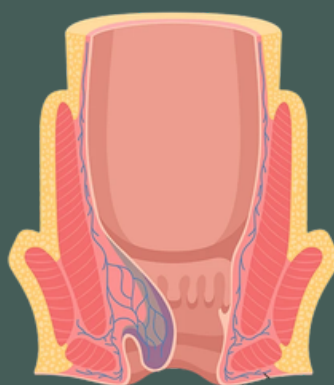

TREATMENT OPTIONS

There Is More Than One Way to Treat Internal Hemorrhoids.

Treatment depends on your symptoms, hemorrhoid grade, medical history, and personal goals.

Watchful Waiting

Increase fiber intake, hydration, & healthy bowel habits.

Medication

May provide temporary symptom relief.

Rubber Band Ligation

A common office-based procedure used to treat internal hemorrhoids.

Hemorrhoid Surgery

Surgical removal of hemorrhoids in more severe cases.

Hemorrhoidal Artery Embolization (HEMBO)

A minimally invasive procedure that reduces blood flow to hemorrhoids, helping relieve symptoms and bleeding.

The right treatment is different for every patient. Understanding all available options is important before making a decision.

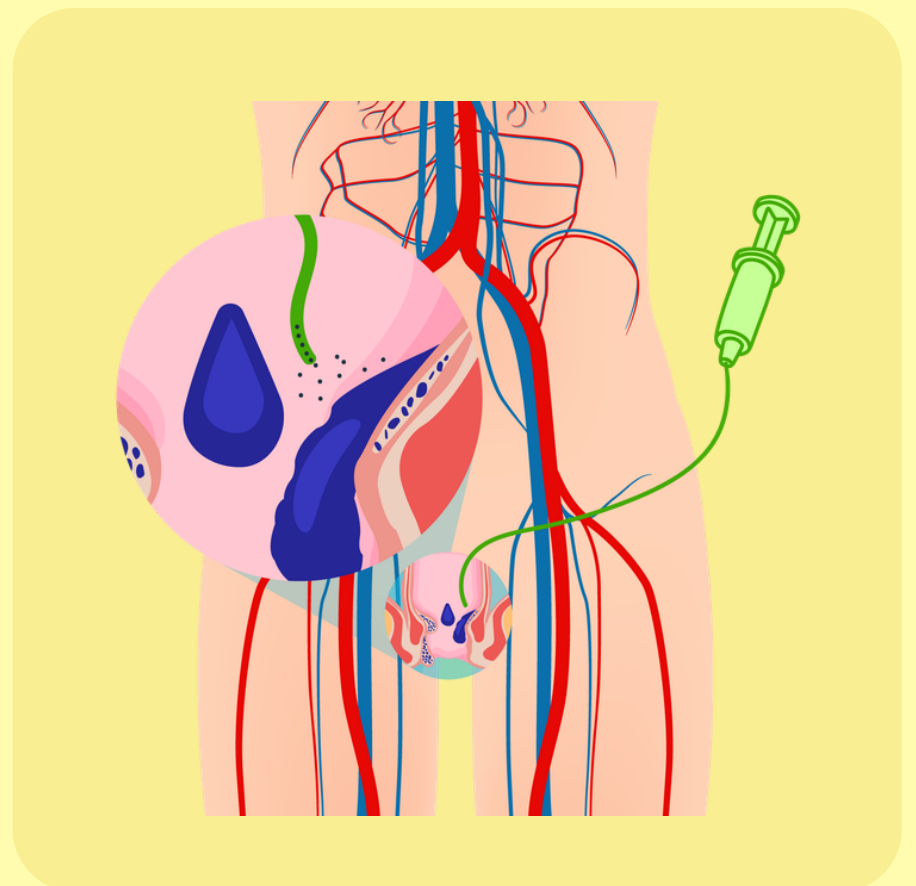
WHY MANY MEN CHOOSE HEMBO

A Minimally Invasive Alternative to Surgery

HEMBO is a non-surgical treatment performed by an Interventional Radiologist. During the procedure, tiny particles are used to reduce blood flow to the arteries supplying the hemorrhoids. As blood flow decreases, symptoms such as bleeding often improve.

Potential Benefits of HEMBO:

- ✓ No major surgery
- ✓ No rectal incisions
- ✓ Minimally invasive
- ✓ Short recovery time
- ✓ Reduced hemorrhoidal bleeding
- ✓ Preservation of normal anatomy
- ✓ Outpatient procedure in many cases
- ✓ Return to normal activities sooner

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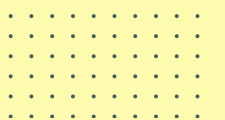
