- Schedule fabrication and installation




- Document your current storage challenges



## Resources

### Typical Hanging Section Heights

Hanging Type	Common Height (inches)	Description
Short Hang (Double Hang)	38" - 42" per section	Stacked double rods for shirts, blouses, and pants. Total system height: 84" - 90"
Long Hang	60" - 66"	Designed for dresses, long coats, and gowns
Mini	24" - 30"	Ideal for kids' clothing, shorts, and small garments
Midi	36" - 44"	Used for shirts, blouses, and folded pants on hangers
Maxi	45" - 50"	Works well for longer shirts, blazers, and jackets
Tall Hang	66"+	Designed for extra long items. Robes, Cultural Garments, Ball Gowns

### Common Useful Measurements

Measurement	Standard Size (inches)	Notes
Standard Hanger Width	17" - 18"	Hangers for adult shirts, jackets, and blouses
Suit & Coat Hanger Width	19" - 22"	Wider to preserve shoulder shape
Child Hanger Width	12" - 14"	Designed for kids' clothing
Hanger Depth (Rod Clearance Needed)	20" - 24"	Allows proper space for hanging without clothes hitting the back wall
Hanging Rod Diameter	1" - 1.5"	Varies based on material and weight capacity
Shoe Storage Height	6" - 8"	May need to adjust for extra tall heels
Boot Storage Height	16" - 22"	Accommodates knee- high boots
Valet Rod Height	50" - 55"	For temporary outfit display and hanging
