Zebras are a **type** of wild horse. They live in small families in different countries in Africa. The plains zebra is the most common and lives in the savanna woodland and treeless **grasslands** of southern and eastern Africa.

Zebras are best known for their **stripy** bodies. Every zebra has a different pattern of stripes, just like human **fingerprints**. A baby zebra is called a **foal**. When they are born, foals have reddish-brown stripes that turn darker to become **black** as they grow.

Zebras are **herbivores** which means they don't eat meat. A zebra will eat fresh **grass**, leaves, twigs and bark. They will often walk for hundreds of **miles** to find fresh grassland. Lions, **cheetahs** and leopards are predators that will **hunt** zebra but because they can run very fast, zebras are often able to run away from **predators**.

If they are **attacked**, zebras will always protect their young or any injured zebras in their **herd**. They don't leave any of their herd behind!
