BIG IDEA

God, King of glory and grace, is worthy of our worship.

OUTLINE

This Psalm stirs your heart to worship God knowing that...

1. You are designed for God (v. 1-2) – He created and owns everything
2. You are desperate for grace (v. 3-6) – He is perfectly holy, and He is gracious
3. You are delivered for glory (v. 7-10) – He is the victorious King

CALL TO RESPOND

1. Be grateful that the transcendent Creator of the Universe takes personal interest in you.
2. Give up self-righteousness and self-sufficiency to cling to Christ.
3. Look forward to Jesus's victorious return.
4. Celebrate present victories of faith.

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. In the 21st century, we tend to think of God as Creator mainly in contrast to Darwinian evolution. That's an important truth, but the Bible points to many more implications of God being our Creator. What are some of those implications, and how does this truth shape your everyday life?
2. The worshippers approaching God's presence are confronted with His perfect holiness. How high is God's standard, and what does that reveal about our ability to meet it on our own?
3. What God demands, He also supplies. We need Him to make us clean and able to approach Him. Looking at Jacob's example, how should we think about approaching God when we're aware of our own sin?
4. Christ is risen, and Christ is returning. In what ways do we already share in His victory over sin, death, and the devil right now? What would it look like to live each day in anticipation of His return?

DIRECT APPLICATION

1. Are you enjoying the intimacy with God that you were designed for or does He feel distant to you? As a group, discuss what practical steps you can take to enjoy intimacy with God.
2. Share with your group where you are most tempted to self-sufficiency and self-righteousness. What would it look like to bring that specific area to God this week?
3. How can you celebrate the victories of faith (a great deliverance, an answer to prayer, a mighty work of God, a salvation story)? What are you celebrating this week?
