

## BLENDING LEARNING FOR FIRST AID

FAA are allowing a blended learning approach for the delivery of first aid qualifications.

Trainer/assessors must use and ensure full completion of the FAA course paperwork produced for classroom training and adhere to all guidance and normal requirements such as confirmation of learner identification.

Following the requirements of the [First Aid Awarding Organisation Forum](#), there are limits on the amount of time that can be spent delivering the qualifications through a webinar:

- First aid qualifications, such as the FAA Award in First Aid at Work and Emergency First Aid at Work, must have a minimum of two-thirds of the training time conducted face to face in the classroom with a maximum of one third allowed through webinar training (i.e. Emergency First Aid at Work must have a minimum of 4 hours face to face classroom teaching/assessment)
- For paediatric first aid, in line with DfE recommendations, the Emergency Paediatric First Aid (6 hour) course can only be delivered face to face in a classroom. Blended learning is allowed for the full Paediatric First Aid (12-hour course) with a minimum of 6 hours of face to face classroom training required

Trainer/assessors should approach blended learning in the same way as they would classroom learning and are able to teach the modules stated below through webinar software.

Trainer/assessors must ensure all learners are taught all modules either through webinar or classroom training. **All practical elements, assessment scenarios, and written assessments where appropriate, must be completed face to face in the classroom.**

All modules that are taught through a webinar will be assessed in the same set practical scenarios and written assessments (if appropriate) that are used in the classroom.

The tables below state which modules of the qualification are available to deliver through webinar software and which modules of the qualifications **MUST** be delivered face to face in a classroom.

Stated within this document are the modules that you can and cannot deliver through a webinar for the following qualifications:
