- 1 B — Fiction offers emotional truths through invented events.
- 2 B — “Theory of mind” is identified as a potential benefit.
- 3 C — Film provides sound and image; prose does not.
- 4 A — The essay names precision, discussion, and creative responses.
- 5 C — The “escapist” criticism is raised and rebutted.
- 6 C — Good fiction shows competing duties and mixed motives.
- 7 B — Non-fiction gives scaffolding of what happened; fiction explores how it felt.
- 8 B — Fiction is called a civilising necessity that helps us practise being human.
- 9 B — A “laboratory” suggests safe experimentation with ideas.
- 10 B — Slowing judgement promotes reflective, fair evaluation.
- 11 B — Stepping back provides distance to reassess problems.
- 12 B — Readers must actively construct meaning: interpretative labour.
- 13 B — Valuing only data neglects humane, sympathetic application.
- 14 B — Patronising texts reduce engagement and thoughtful response.
- 15 C — Reading habits nurture qualities important for citizenship.
- 16 B — People often contain contradictions; fiction reflects this.
- 17 C — “Artificial” here means consciously crafted or man-made.
- 18 C — “Resilience” = capacity to recover and adapt under pressure.
- 19 B — “Inhabit” functions as a verb.
- 20 C — “Precision” is a noun naming a quality.
- 21 B — “Achievements” should be “achievements” (i before e after ch → achieve).
- 22 A — “Innocent” should be “innocent” (double n).
- 23 E — No mistake: meticulous, athletes, appropriately, exhausted are correct.
- 24 B — “Unforeseen” should be “unforeseen” (insert re).
- 25 C — Should be “complimentary” meaning free of charge; “complementary” means matching.
- 26 B — Comma needed after the introductory clause: “Although the play began late, ...”.
- 27 A — List requires commas: “portraits, landscapes, and sketches”.
- 28 B — Missing comma after the reporting clause: “she whispered, ‘we might...’”.
- 29 C — Parenthetical needs commas: “Amir felt calm, even confident, as...”.
- 30 E — No punctuation error; commas are correctly used.
- 31 B — “By degrees” means gradually.
- 32 C — A cough would echo in high rafters.
- 33 D — Small gains “feed” a reservoir; accumulation metaphor.
- 34 A — “A thin sun” is idiomatic for weak sunlight.
