## **DESCRIPTION OF THE STUDY**

Longitudinal research „Language” is carried out by BISS (Baltic Institute of Social Sciences). The annual survey of the project „Language” was conducted from March 7 – April 11, 2008.

The sample of the survey was 2002 respondents in whole area of Latvia. The method used – direct interviews at the places of residence. Multi level stratified random sample was applied and ensured representativeness of the Latvian residents of age 15-74. The results of the survey were additionally weighted by gender, age, nationality, type of residence and region according to newest data of Central Statistical Bureau of the Republic of Latvia. Among all respondents there were 1425 with Latvian as native language, 456 – with Russian and 121 – with other. The results of the research were compared to the data of previous surveys that were conducted since June 1996 and had samples of about 2000 respondents.

The report consists of analytical part, diagrams and tables.

## MAIN CONCLUSIONS

The survey of 2008 is the annual stage of the study on state language knowledge and attitudes that has been conducted since 1996. During the years since 1996 there have been 13 surveys of inhabitants of Latvia. The goal of these annual surveys is to observe the results of the language policy implemented in Latvia, the changes of language skills, usage of Latvian in society as well as attitudes towards Latvian language. At the same time the research allows to indicate broader context of implementation of state language policy: changes in the language environment and competition between languages as well as connection between learning the language and social integration.

From 1996 till 2004 surveys were conducted with one year interval (with the exception of 1997 and 1998, when two surveys were conducted per year), however the routine had changed during the last years: the survey of 2008 was conducted after less than a year interval since the previous research (fall of 2007), and between survey of 2007 and the previous one there was a three year interval. It must be stressed that exactly these three years (2004 – 2007) were a turning point of the tendencies revealed in the previous years. If during the first years of the millennium attitudes towards the state language had a tendency to worsen, then results of surveys conducted in 2007 and 2008 showed the opposite.

The longitudinal research allows concluding that ethno-political context, discussions and political choices have a great influence on the formation of attitudes towards the state language. For example, at time, when there was the strongest opposition to the education reform and biggest discussions about the means and ends of the implementation of the reform, the attitude of non-Latvians towards speaking Latvian was more negative, but with more stable implementation of the reform a compromise on proportions of languages of instruction in high schools had been reached, methodological materials and textbooks had been prepared as well as Latvian language courses and other activities that allowed to see the implementation of the reform as a stable process. With all this the attitude towards speaking Latvian language in daily communication has become more positive.

Considering this situation, it is necessary to continue these research series in order to explore the further dynamics of behaviour and attitudes that would allow evaluating the feedback of state language policy in a multilingual society such as Latvia.

### *State language skills among minorities*

Annual survey results show the consequences of the state language policy: it can be observed that the level of language skills, speaking habits evaluated by years change rather slowly, however changes over ten years show that Latvian language skills among non-Latvians have improved considerably. 57% of non-Latvians report good Latvian language skills (36% in 1996). The group that does not know Latvian at all is slowly decreasing (22% in 1996, 7% in 2008). The most notable changes of Latvian language knowledge have occurred among young people. The number of people who speak Latvian language very well has considerably increased. If 49% of respondents evaluated their Latvian language skills as good in 1996, then 73% of young people (aged 15-34) gave the same assessment of their skills in 2008. Changes in other age groups are lesser, but there have been

improved state language skills as well. The greatest changes have occurred with those, who more than ten years ago did not know Latvian language at all. For example, 41% of those aged 50 to 74 did not know the language in 1996, but in 2008 only 10% of the same group did not know it.

### *Speaking the state language*

The research shows that both the number of those who have good Latvian language skills and usage of language in different life situations is increasing, particularly usage of language in public space. It must be stressed that there are great differences of language usage at work ten years ago and now. Research data show that ten years ago there were 59% of Russian speakers who spoke only Russian at work, but only 9% of respondents spoke mostly Latvian, however in 2008 there are only 28% of Russian speakers who communicate only in Russian at work, but 32% mostly use Latvian. Regarding language use on the street, at shops changes during past ten years are less evident. It is interesting that the number of those who speak only Russian at home has decreased: in 1996 – 79%, but in 2008 – 69%, accordingly the number to those who more or less use Latvian as a means of communication at home has increased. But the data on speaking Latvian language with friends does not show notable changes. These data lead to conclusions that in situations, where language speaking is regulated by formal rules, Language law, for instance, in workplaces, the usage of state language is increasing more rapidly, but in situations, where the choice of the language depends on the individual, for instance, on the street, at shop, in the communication with friends Russian language is spoken more often. The speaking of Latvian language is promoted by formal language environment, the use of language regulated by law, particularly in the public space.

### *Decline of self-sufficiency of Russian language*

The research also shows a decrease in that group of inhabitants who speak only Russian as a means of communication in public space: in 2004 one third (31%) of non-Latvians from all employed respondents spoke only Russian in the public space (at work, with friends, on the street, at shop), which meant that one third of non-Latvians could consider Russian language as self-sufficient. But in 2008 only 20% of employed non-Latvians use only Russian for communication in the public space. The decline of self-sufficiency of minority language can be regarded as a significant proof of consolidation of the status of the majority language.

### *Language environment*

Although the Latvian language is in conditions of fierce competition, the survey data of 2008 suggests that in the public space the language environment has changed to benefit Latvian language. Russian speakers more often hear Latvian language both in daily situations on the street and in electronic mass media. It must be particularly stressed that since the first surveys in the mid-1990s the presence of Latvian language in electronic mass media was constantly decreasing till 2004, but the surveys over last few years indicated a certain turn in favor of Latvian language. The survey of 2008 reveals notable increase in the number of those who have mentioned that they hear Latvian language a lot on radio and TV. True, there can be various explanations of the survey data on Latvian language presence in public space, particularly in mass media. Considering the previous

conclusions that during the last years Latvian language skills have improved among Russian speakers, we can assume that with the improvement of language skills Russian speaker ability to hear Latvian language increases. But the data do not allow to draw conclusions that media consumption in other languages, including Russian language, is decreasing. The data from the survey of 2008 also show that the role of Latvian language has increased among colleagues at workplaces during the last years: 69% of Russian speakers confirm that they hear Latvian language at work. That is more than ever before, if one compares survey data obtained since 1996.

#### *Status of the Latvian language from inhabitant point of view*

The fact that almost 100% of Latvians and about 95% of Russians consider that every resident of Latvia should have a free command of Latvian language also indicates that the status of Latvian language has become stable. More reserved attitude towards the importance of state language skills was at time, when there were the strongest discussions about education reform. However over the last years the number of those, who feel that Latvian language skills are necessary for every resident of Latvia, has become stable. At the same time it is also evident that the importance of the Russian language has increased in the views of all ethnic groups in Latvia over the last years. The research shows a gradual increase both in the number of those Latvians who feel that it is important for all residents of the country to have a good command of the Russian language and in the number of those Russian speakers who admit the necessity of Latvian language skills. On the one hand, that indicates that there is a competition between languages, because respondents feel that it is necessary to have a command of both Russian and Latvian languages. On the other hand, this data suggests the hypothesis that there is an increase in tolerance towards languages, as people in both ethno-linguistic groups are increasingly agreeing that the other language is important, too.

#### *Russian language skills among Latvians*

The research also reveals that the number of Russian speakers among ethnic Latvians is diminishing gradually from year to year and that has been particularly true over the last years: if in 1996, 84% of Latvian respondents rated their Russian language skills as good, then in 2008 that percentage notably dropped to 69%. Weaker Russian language skills are found among younger Latvians, in the 15-34 age group 54% speak Russian language well, 38% have fairly poor language skills, but 8% do not speak Russian at all. It is important to stress that the linguistic situation between Russian speakers and Latvians becomes less asymmetrical: 69% of Latvians have good Russian language skills, but 57% of non-Latvians have a good command of Latvian language. Among young people asymmetry of language skills has already changed in the opposite direction: 73% of non-Latvian young people have good Latvian language skills, but 54% of Latvian young people say the same about their Russian language skills. Readily evident are the consequences of education policy: Latvian language skills among Russian speaking young people are increasing, but on the other hand the percentage of Latvian young people who have a command of the Russian language is dropping. This fact propose a question to what extent that is a loss or a benefit, if there is a decline in the number of speakers of any language in society. There have been remarks in mass media that Latvian young people are less competitive in the labor market comparing to Russians, as many of

them lack the Russian language skills, but the Latvian language skills of Russian young people are increasing more and more.

Generally evaluating the dynamics of survey results, series of positive changes which indicate that the status of the Latvian language is firming up among minority populations should be noted: the skills of state language have improved, the public environment in which Latvian is spoken has expanded, and attitudes towards the speaking of Latvian have improved. Looking from this point of view the results of the implementation of state language policy can be evaluated as positive. At the same time it can be seen that the speaking of state language is becoming more stable in the formal environment, where the use of language is regulated by law, but in the situations, where the choice of language is up to the individual the preference is given to native language. That suggests that the language policy is not so successful in the context of social integration, as the attitude of non-Latvians towards state language is more instrumental regarding its usefulness. Concerning language as integration mechanism – to promote understanding of culture and free communication – it is considerably weaker motivation for learning and speaking Latvian language.

## RESEARCH RESULTS

### The native language

The results of the 2008 survey show that for 97% of Latvians and 99% of Russians ethnic belonging and their native language match. The situation is different among respondents of other nationalities. 14% of them have said that their native language is Latvian, 43,6% - Russian, but 42,6% have mentioned some other language (Figure 1.1.). If we consider the way in which the native language identity has changed among ethnic minorities since the start of the new millennium, then we see that people are gradually becoming less likely to consider Russian to be their native language, however the number of those who consider another language to be their native tongue is increasing (Figure 1.2.).

### Language use

The study shows that both the number of Latvian speakers and its usage in different life situations are increasing, particularly in public space. At the same time it must be stressed that over the last several years state language speaking habits in various life situations have changed differently.

Both Latvians and Russian speakers typically report that at home they speak mostly their native language. Among Latvians some 90% mainly speak Latvian at home, but about 70% of Russian speakers mostly speak Russian there (Figure 2.1. and 2.2.). It is interesting that the number of those who speak only Russian at home has decreased, while the number of those who more or less speak Latvian as a means of communication at home has increased (26% in 2008, but about 20% in the 1990s). As regards speaking Latvian with friends, the role of Latvian has not changed: in 1996, 23% mostly spoke Latvian, in 2008 – 15%.

It is interesting that ten years ago and now the language use at work is considerably different. Research data show that ten years ago 60% of Russian speakers spoke only Russian at work, but only 9% spoke mostly Latvian. However in 2008 there are only 28% of Russian speakers who speak exclusively Russian at work, but 32% speak mostly Latvian as a means of communication at work. As regards language use on the street, at shop, the changes over the last ten years are less notable: in 1996 40% spoke only Russian, but in 2008 – 31%. Ten years ago there were 20% of those who spoke Latvian on the street and when shopping, but in 2008 – 26% spoke mainly Latvian.

These data suggest a conclusion that in situations where the use of language is regulated by formal rules, Language law, for instance, at workplaces, the speaking of state language is increasing rapidly, but in situations where the language choice depends on the individual, for instance, on the street, at shop, in communication with friends the Russian language is spoken more often. The use of Latvian language is promoted by formal language environment, use of languages regulated by law, particularly in public space.

The research data show that over the last years the number of those non-Latvians who speak only Russian in the public space has declined, for instance, those who speak only Russian at work. More often people speak Latvian alongside Russian. Latvian is spoken more often in the public space by rural residents (not counting the region of Latgale) than by urban residents.

The survey data allow to indicate the group of Russian speakers for whom the Russian language is self-sufficient in order to fulfill their daily needs: the study in 2004 revealed that one third (31%) of non-Latvians from all employed respondents spoke only Russian in the public space (at work, with friends, on the street, at shop), which means that one third of non-Latvians could consider Russian language as self-sufficient. That is more common among urban residents, people with lower income and education level. But the survey data of 2008 show that only 20% of employed non-Latvians use only Russian language as means of communication in the public space. The decline of self-sufficiency of minority language can be regarded as a significant proof of consolidation of the status of the majority language.

### **Situations in which Latvian is spoken**

Non-Latvians are most likely to speak Latvian when they are addressed in Latvian and when the other person does not understand Russian (Figure 3). That is an interesting fact and suggests that Latvians can promote speaking Latvian in interpersonal communication with Russians by speaking more in Latvian. About one-half (49%) of non-Latvians speak Latvian in government institutions. About one third (40%) of respondents speak Latvian when they find themselves in a group where Latvians predominate. Latvian is spoken also in situations when only one of those who are present is a Latvian (27%), 24% of Russian speakers speak Latvian in order to practice the language. If we compare data of 2008 to research conducted at the start of the new millennium, then we see that non-Latvian speakers are far more likely to speak Latvian in all of the previously described situations.

### **Attitude toward speaking Latvian**

Survey data over the course of the years have shown shifting tendencies in terms of what people think about speaking the Latvian language: attitudes improved in the first few years of the new millennium, but over the later years the number of those for whom speaking Latvian creates positive emotions decreased. 2008 survey shows that the number of those who have positive attitude towards speaking Latvian has considerably increased comparing to 2000 (37% in 2008 and 29% in 2000). However the number of those who have neutral attitude towards speaking Latvian has decreased: 38% in 2008 and 45% in 2000. But the number of those who do not like to speak Latvian at all since 2000 has been unsteady: there are 8% of those in 2008, 11% in 2004, but 7% in 2000 (Figure 4).

The results of the longitudinal research show that at a time, when there was the strongest opposition to the education reform, biggest discussions about the means and ends of the implementation of the reform, the attitude of non-Latvians towards speaking Latvian was more negative, but with more stable implementation of the reform a compromise on proportions of languages of instruction in high schools had been reached, methodological materials and textbooks had been prepared as well as Latvian language courses and other activities that allowed to see the implementation of the reform as a stable process. With all this the attitude towards speaking Latvian language in daily communication has become more positive.

Negative attitudes towards speaking the Latvian language are found more commonly among older and less educated people.

## **Language skills**

Latvian language skills are gradually improving among non-Latvians. 57% of non-Latvians have good Latvian language skills (47% in 2004) (Figure 5.1.) The percentage of respondents who can hardly speak the language is gradually decreasing (10% in 2004, 7% in 2008).

Looking at changes in language skills since the mid-1990s, we see that among different language-related skills, the ability to speak the Latvian language has increased the most: if in the mid-1990s only 40% of non-Latvians reported that they could speak the language freely, now that percentage has risen to 69%.

The most significant changes in Latvian language skills can be seen among young people. The number of those who have a good command of the language has increased substantially. If in the late 1990s about 40% evaluated their own Latvian language skills as being good, then in 2008, the same was said by 73% of young people (aged 15-34) (Figure 5.2). The changes in other age groups have been less significant, but improvements in state language skills can be seen across the board. Among non-citizens, it must be emphasised, 14% of respondents do not speak the Latvian language at all, but 49% have poor skills. The fact that one-third of non-citizens have good Latvian language skills (37%), however, indicates that the failure to learn the state language is not the only factor which keeps some people from pursuing Latvian citizenship.

On the other hand the percentage of Russian speakers among ethnic Latvians has declined a bit, and that has particularly been true in recent years: if in 1993, 84% of Latvians said that they had good Russian language skills, then the percentage has dropped to just 69% of Latvian respondents in 2008 (Figure 6). Poorer Russian language skills are found among younger people, in the 15-34 age group, 54% know the language well, 38% of young people know it poorly, but 8% do not know Russian at all.

It is important here that the linguistic situation between Russian speakers and Latvians becomes less asymmetrical: 69% of Latvians have good Russian language skills, but among non-Latvians 57% have good Latvian language skills. Among young people asymmetry of language skills has changed to opposite, as 73% non-Latvian young people have good Latvian language skills, but 54% of Latvians say the same about their Russian language skills.

## **Testing of Latvian language skills**

About 40% of surveyed non-Latvians have undergone language skills attestation. No respondent reported having failed the test (Figure 7.1). 15% passed at the highest level, 23% passed at the medium level, and 6% passed at the lowest level.

The highest-level attestation was obtained more often by women, by people with a higher level of education and income, and by people of pre-retirement age.

## Learning the Latvian language

School is the main place where people learn Latvian language. More than half of the respondents (54%) reported that they learned Latvian language at school (Figure 9). The fact that 72% of young people mentioned school, while much less of respondents of other age groups did the same (49% of those in the 35-49 age group and just 44% among those aged 50 to 74) indicates that the education system has ensured Latvian language learning to a far greater degree since the restoration of Latvia's independence in 1991 than was the case during the Soviet era.

The language courses are more often attended by people with higher education (32%), but less often by those with an incomplete high school education (2%); women attend courses more often (18%) than men (8%), and also women are more likely to have learned the language at work or study team (41%) than men (28%). Many young people say that communication with friends Latvians has helped them learn Latvian language (40%).

The number of those who learn Latvian at work or in study team is gradually increasing (26% in 2003, 35% in 2008).

## Language courses

13% of all non-Latvians have attended various Latvian language courses (Figure 9). Among those Russian speakers, who attended courses, most frequently those were courses at language schools (54%), as well as courses at workplaces (but not in the context of courses organized by the National Agency for Latvian Language Training (LVAVA)) – 27% (Figure 10). 2% of respondents attended LAT2 courses organized by LVAVA. It must be added that in 2004, when there was a transition to Latvian as language of instruction in Russian high schools, the LVAVA courses were more popular (18% of respondents attended them). The courses organized by the Naturalization Board are becoming more popular (3% in 2003, but 7% in 2004, 16% in 2008 attended them). Russian speakers have more often than in the past hired private tutors to learn the language individually (4% in 2004 and 12% in 2008).

## The environment of the Latvian language

Even though the Latvian language faces stiff competition in the overall linguistic environment in Latvia, data from the 2008 survey show that in the public arena, the environment has changed in favour of the Latvian language (Figure 11.1). Non-Latvians say that the main place where they hear the Latvian language is in everyday life and on the street. It should be noted that over the last years the number of those who hear Latvian language in everyday life and on the street has considerably increased (64% in 2004, but 71% in 2008).

Less often than in everyday life and on the street, non-Latvians hear the Latvian language in the media: 48% on the radio, 59% on TV. It must be stressed, however, that in comparison to the survey in 2004, which showed smaller environment in which Latvian was spoken (in 2004 36% mentioned the radio and 49% - TV), the survey of 2008 showed that the number of those respondents who say that they hear Latvian language a lot on radio and TV has notably increased (Figure 11.1). It is also noteworthy that since the first surveys in the mid-1990s, the presence of the

Latvian language had been diminishing in the media world, but the surveys conducted over the last years marked a certain turn in favour of the Latvian language. True, there can be various explanations for the data which show the presence of the Latvian language in the public space and, particularly, in the mass media. Considering the previous conclusions that Latvian language skills have improved among Russian speakers over the last years, we can assume that along with this comes an increased ability among Russian speakers to hear the Latvian language. The data do not, however, allow one to conclude that consumption of mass media is diminishing in other languages, including Russian language.

2008 survey data also show that the role of the Latvian language has increased at places of employment: 69% of Russian speakers said that they hear Latvian at work. That is more than ever before if we compare the survey data which have been collected since 1996.

### **Creating a Latvian language environment for non-Latvians**

Both Latvians and non-Latvians think that the best way to expand the Latvian language environment for non-Latvians is to speak Latvian to them (56% and 30%) (Figure 12). Non-Latvians also think that language teaching in schools should be improved, with many respondents mentioning the need for bilingual education (33%) and calling for cheap or free-of-charge Latvian language courses (37%). Latvians are more likely to say that non-Latvians should themselves take the initiative of entering the Latvian linguistic environment and trying to speak the language (36%).

### **Sufficiency and improvements in Latvian language skills**

As was the case in 2004, survey data in 2008 also showed an increasing percentage of respondents who rate their own Latvian language skills as sufficient. Those who have poorer skills, of course, are less likely to say so (Figure 13). Among those with very poor skills, only 13% rate them as sufficient. Among those at the lowest attested level of language skills, 31% said that their skills are adequate, while among those at the medium level of attestation 75% felt the same. 37% of respondents believe that they still need to improve their Latvian language skills (Figure 14.1). Of course, this was less common among those with the medium or highest level of attested language skills.

It should be noted that in the group aged 15 to 50 almost one-half (46%) said that they would like to improve their Latvian language skills (Figure 14.2), however, this willing decreases significantly when person passes age of 50 years.

When people who said that they do not wish to improve their Latvian language skills were asked why this was the case, the largest percentage (44%) said that it was because their skills were already sufficient (Figure 15). It should be noted, that 15% confirmed that they would never need any Latvian language skills.

### **Methods for learning the Latvian language**

Asked about the best way to learn the Latvian language, 40% of non-Latvians spoke of language courses, 29% favoured private tutoring. Less frequently a need for text books and television

programmes (24%), educational programmes on the Internet (23%), and far fewer a need for audio and video cassettes (3-6%) or CDs (4%) were mentioned (Figure 16.1).

Asked how much they would be prepared to spend for Latvian language courses, people have been saying the same thing ever since 1996 – they would be ready to spend around Ls 14 for the process. However, over the last few years, the average sum had increased from Ls 14 in 2004 to Ls 21 in 2008. (Figure 17.2).

### Information about distance learning

The survey data show that there is more information each year about distance learning opportunities in Latvia. In 2000 only 17% of surveyed respondents knew what distance learning was, while in 2008, the same was true among 42% (Figure 18). 19% of non-Latvians felt that distance learning might be of use to them, 66% did not think so, and 15% did not know (Figure 19). People in parental leave as well as persons having higher education and people in Latgale region would be more likely than others to make use of distance learning.

### Problems in language learning

The percentage of respondents who say that they have specific difficulties in learning the Latvian language has decreased from 56% in 1996 to 32% in 2008 (Figure 20). This indicates that non-Latvians consider the Latvian language to be closer and more accessible now than they did in the past. Asked about obstacles against learning the language, respondents speak about age (35%), a lack of time (25%), difficulties to overcome psychological barrier against the language (22%), the complexity of Latvian grammar (22%), a poor memory (20%), the complexity of the language as such (17%), financial problems (16%), lack of opportunities to practice the Latvian language (8%) (Figure 21).

### The media in the Latvian language

Survey data show that after the turn of the millennium, the percentage of Russian speakers in Latvia who made use of the Latvian mass media gradually began to decline – 72% watched television in Latvian in 2004, as opposed to 82% in 2002. The same was true for newspapers (35% as opposed to 45%) and magazines (27% as opposed to 34%). The exception was the radio as there were no changes regarding listening to it (Figure 22). Data from the 2007 and 2008 surveys, however, show that the popularity of the Latvian language mass media has recovered among Russian speakers over the last years and reached the level of 2002.

Survey data from 2008 show that 85% of non-Latvians watch television in Latvian, while 54% - listen to radio, 53% - read newspapers in Latvian language and 46% - magazines.

Regarding different inhabitant groups, it must be noted, that men comparing to women, unemployed persons and those living in Latgale region use all of the previously mentioned media less than other residents of Latvia.

Among Latvian magazines, the most popular ones in the Russian speaking community are „Privātā Dzīve” (13% of non-Latvians report reading it), „Ieva” (10%), „Santa” (6%), „Cosmopolitan” (4%) and „Mūsmājas” (5%) (Figure 23).

Among newspapers, the most popular ones are regional or local newspapers (23%), „5 min” in Latvian (10%), „Diena” (9%), „Latvijas Avīze” (9%) „Rīgas Santīms” (5%), „Vakara Ziņas” (4%), „Neatkarīgā Rīta Avīze” (3%), (Figure 24).

Asked about television channels on which programmes are shown in Latvia, non-Latvians most often cited LNT (29%), TV3 (24%), while less popular are LTV 1 (14%), TV5 Riga (13%) and LTV 7 (8%) (Figure 25).

Asked what kinds of shows they watch on TV, non-Latvians most often spoke of feature films and soap operas (18%), news (16%), game shows (4%), entertainment and humour programmes (4%), and sports (3%) (Figure 25).

The LNT news programme is the most popular show of its kind among non-Latvians, with 19% of Russian speakers watching it. The Latvian Public Television news programme „Panorama” lags behind at 17%.

The most popular Latvian radio stations among non-Latvians are Radio SWH (21%), Radio Latvia 2 (14%), Radio Skonto (12%), Star FM (10%), European Hit Radio (7%), Radio Latvia 1 (6%). (Figure 26).

When Russian speakers are asked what keeps them from reading, listening to or watching the Latvian language mass media, they are less likely now than in the past to attribute this to lack of money or lack of time. Instead, respondents have been more likely to speak of personal preference as an obstacle for reading, listening to or watching Latvian mass media. (Figure 28).

## Importance of various languages

Almost everyone in Latvia says that the status of the Latvian language is stable and widely recognised. 97% of respondents say that it is important for each and every resident of Latvia to speak the Latvian language (Figure 30.1). The importance of English and Russian language is also stated by many respondents – 78% believe that people should be able to speak English, and 81% feel that it is important to have a free command of the Russian language.

Data from 2008 show that almost 100% Latvians and approximately 94% Russians think that everyone in Latvia must speak Latvian. (Figure 30.2). The attitude towards the necessity to speak the state language was somehow reserved during the public discussions on minority education reform. At the same time, during the last few years the increasing recognition of the significance of Russian language is observable among all ethnic groups in Latvia. 74% of Latvians feel that it is important to speak the language, while 96% non-Latvian speakers do the same (Figure 30.3). According to the survey, the percentage of Latvians who feel that it is important for everyone in Latvia to speak the Russian language freely has been increasing since 2002 – 56% back then, 74% this year. The same is true of Russian speakers who support the idea that Latvian must be spoken – 87% in 2002, and 94% in 2008. On the one hand, these data indicate competition among languages, because people feel that it is important to speak both languages. On the other hand, data suggest that

there are now greater tolerance towards languages, as in both ethno-linguistic groups people are more likely to recognise the importance of the other language. The increase of tolerance towards other languages is indicated also by other data of this survey. For example, the number of respondents admitting that they speak Latvian heartily and with pleasure has increased during the last few years, while the number of people feeling negative emotions while speaking Latvian has decreased.

The importance of English language is also very high in Latvia - 78% of Latvians and 79% of Russian speakers consider it important to learn that language. (Figure 30.4). Here we see similar views in both groups.

### **The Latvian language in minority schools**

90% of Latvians and more than a half of Russian speakers (57%) support the idea that classes in minority schools should be taught in Latvian. If we break the answers down by level of Latvian language skills among Russian speakers, then we see that the higher the level of person's language skills, the more likely the respondents to support the teaching of classes in Latvian.

### **Selection of schools**

Data from 2008 show that increasing number of minority parents choose to send their children to schools where classes are taught in Latvian (31% in 2004, 43% in 2008). In 2004, 68% of children with Russian speaking parents studied at a bilingual school. In the latest survey, 52% of respondents reported that it was the case (Figure 32). Parents with good Latvian language skills are more likely to choose to send their kids to a school where classes are taught in Latvian.

Asked why they select a Latvian school for their children, Russian speaking parents talk about their desire for the children to learn both the Latvian language and their native language (Figure 33). In this survey more than in 2004 parents gave the argument that Latvian schools offer a higher level of educational quality (Figure 33).

The motivation to choose Russian school is based on a wish for a child to command both Latvian language and his or her native language, and conviction that this school provides better quality of education (Figure 33).


### **Awareness of LVAVA**

According to survey data, approximately one fourth of the residents of Latvia (23%) has heard something about the National Agency for Latvian Language Training (LVAVA) or knows in general about its activities, while 1% of respondents are very well informed about it. If we break the answers down by social demographic groups, it is observable that persons with lower educational level, pensioners, and unemployed persons are more likely to be among uninformed persons. These social demographic characteristics indicate that the level of awareness of LVAVA is closely related with the definite target group directly affected by the activities of the LVAVA. Despite the impact of these activities on considerably larger part of society, however, it would not be justified to expect high level of awareness in all the groups of society.







### 1.2. Native language of non - Latvians and non-Russians






**3. In which of the mentioned situations do you usually use Latvian?**


**4. How would you characterise your attitude towards speaking in Latvian?**



### 5.1. How would you evaluate your knowledge of Latvian?



(division by age groups)**








**8. When did you pass the certification?**




### 10. What kind of courses of Latvian did you use?












**14.2. Would you like to improve your knowledge of Latvian?**







































**30.2. In your opinion, how important it is for the residents of Latvia to have a good knowledge of Latvian? (division by nationality)**












