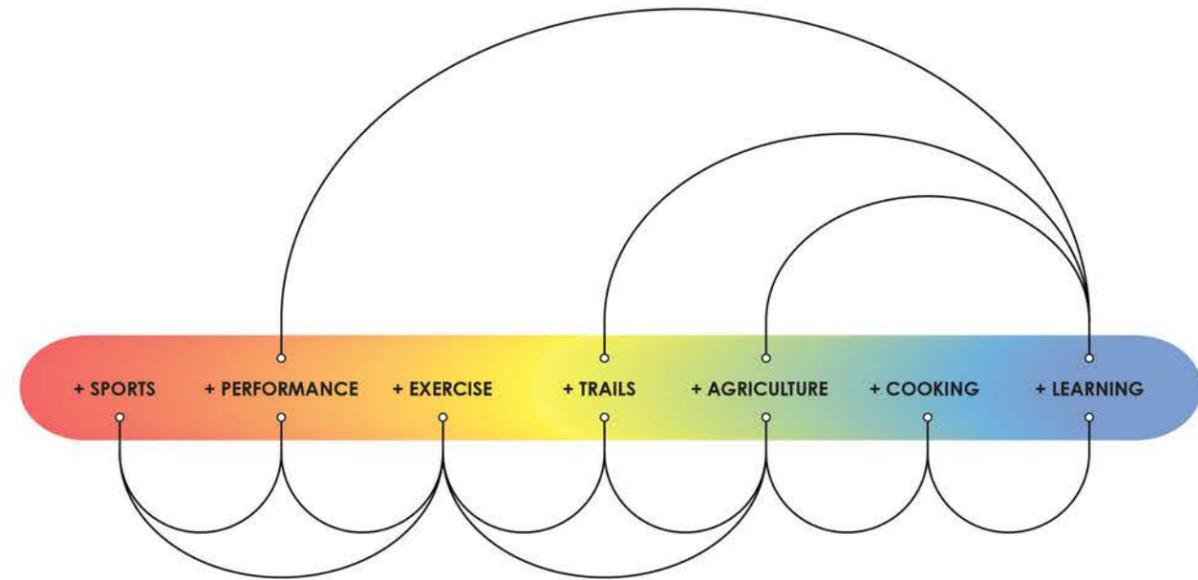
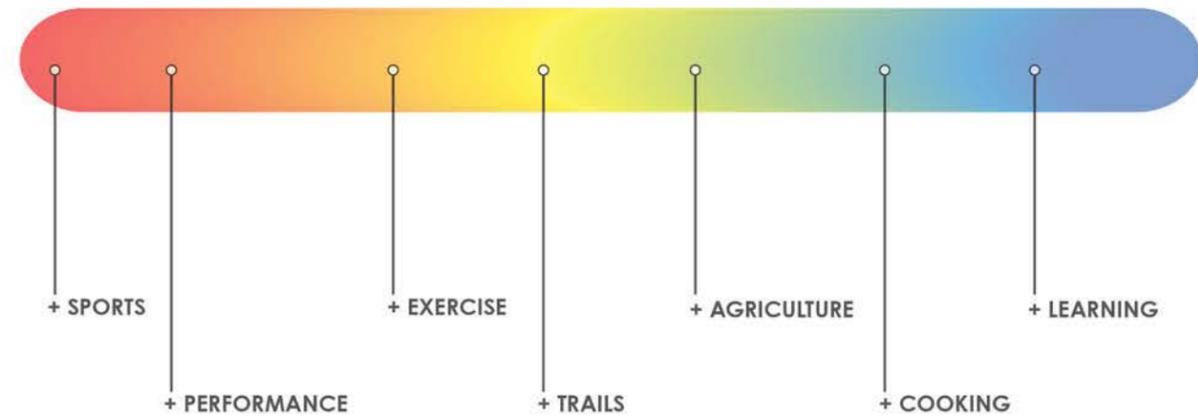
resembles shed construction and historic slave quarters in form and materiality. While experiencing the site, you follow a weaving path through the Grid as you follow the journey like an African American child.





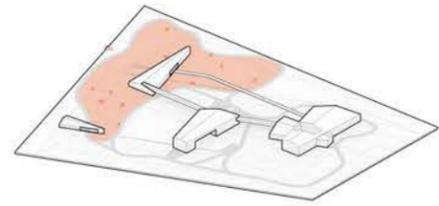

First organize **recreational** program by **rigor** in order to adjust for different **generations**.



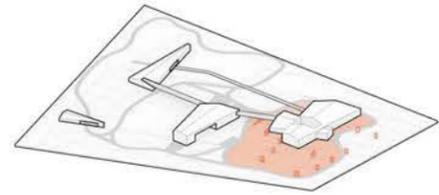
Then we **connect** adjacent program in order to **connect** multiple **generations**.

In Gullah Geechee and West African culture, young children begin their lives at home, in the Village.

The children are then sent far away into the Forest to learn and grow for their own sake.

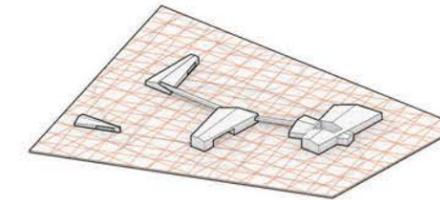


+ THE RETURN HOME

Eventually, those children become adults after their time in the Forest, so they return to nurture the Village

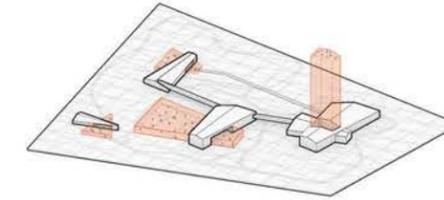

+ Coming of Age of young African Americans



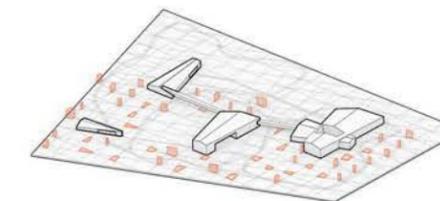
+ THE GRID

The Grid was created by repeating the angles of the site boundaries over and over in order to organize form and program.



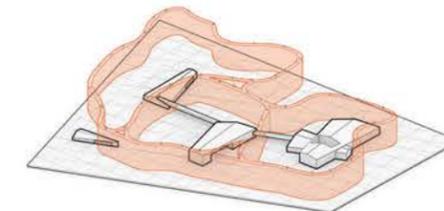
+ EXTRUSION OF THE VOID

Voids are extruded in order to emphasize the communion between generations. Where voids are is where community gathers.



+ FAMILY STONES

These stones are for families of the community to place the names of their ancestors in remembrance.



+ WEAVING THROUGH THE GRID

The whole site is ruled by a grid based on site boundaries. In order to experience the site, you must break free and weave through it.

+ Structurally, each building mimics traditional agricultural shed construction, mass timber built with corrugated tin cladding and corrugated polycarbonate sheathing.

+ Rice field to emphasize cultivation and relearning history through growth.

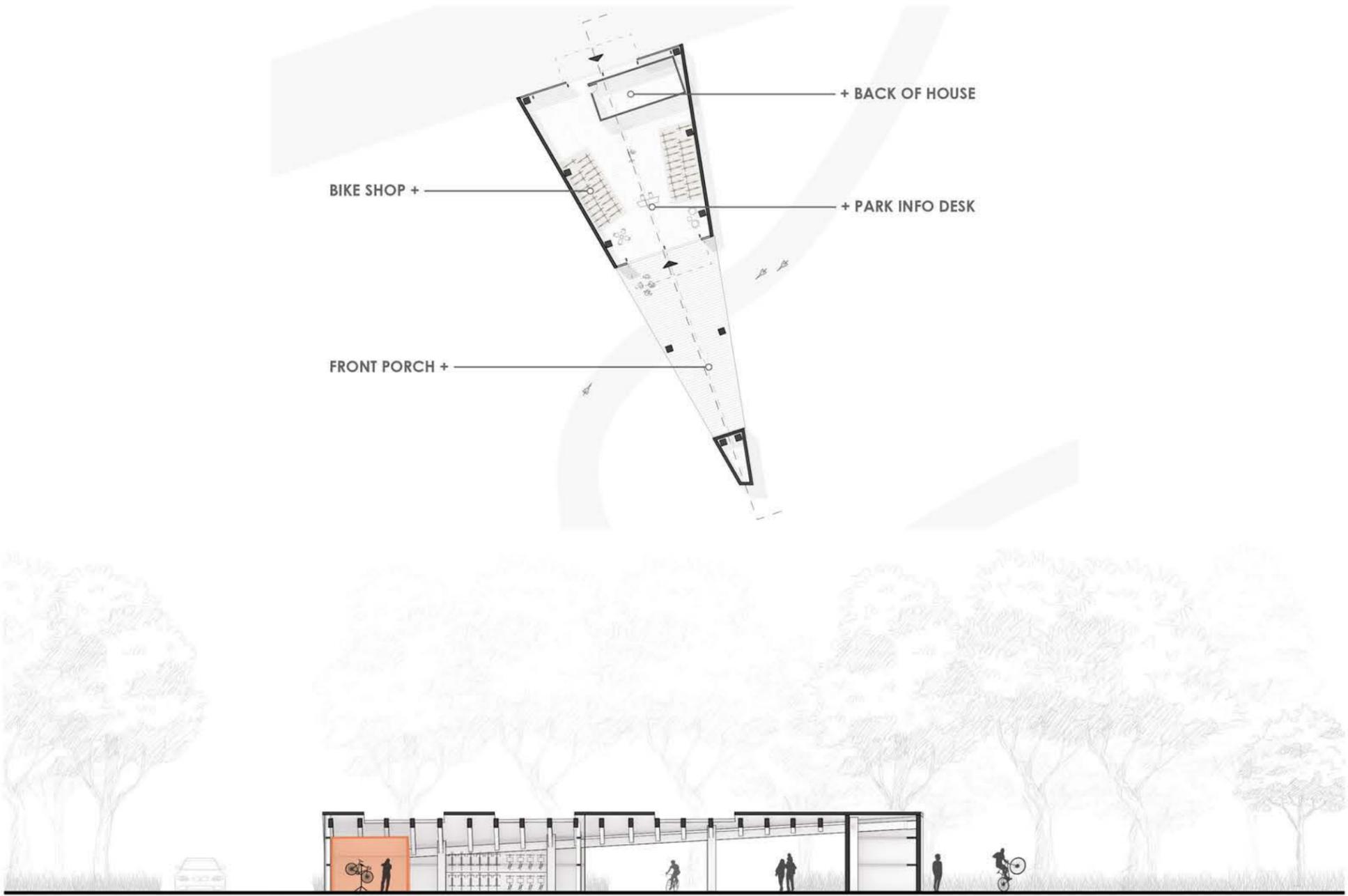
+ Manicured grass field to encourage play and congregation.

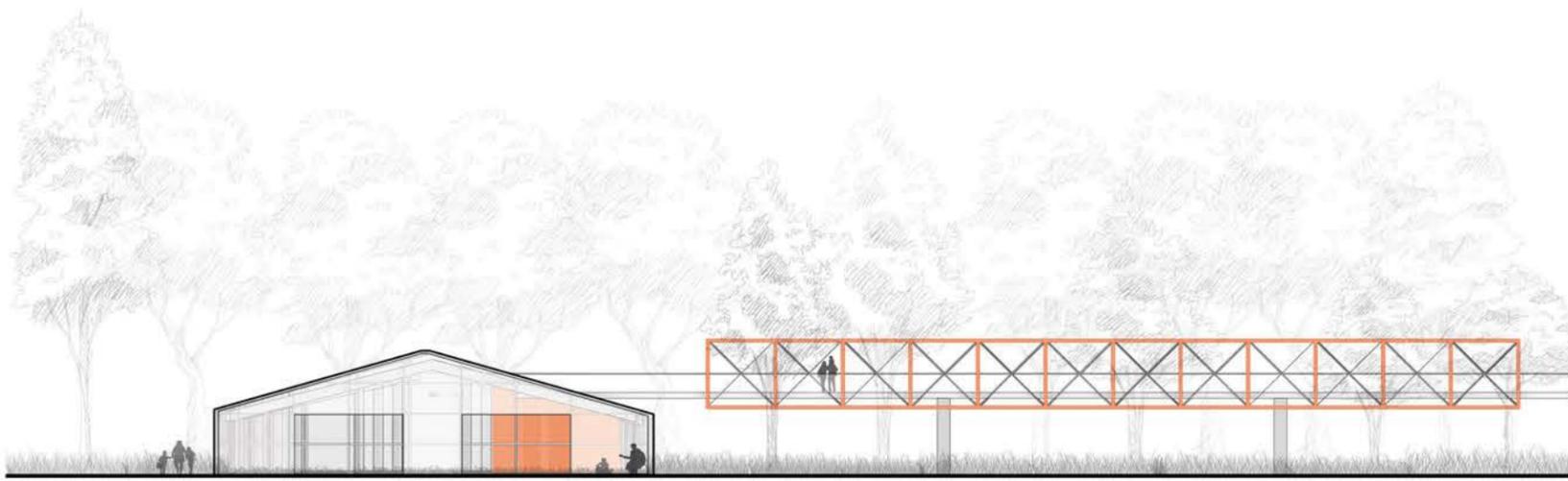
+ **BIKE BARN** + Bike Barn to encourage fluid movement throughout the site while referencing the Tour De Plantersville, a major cycling event.

+ Cultivation Center for everyone to learn how to grow and cook their own food while also enjoying the company of others.

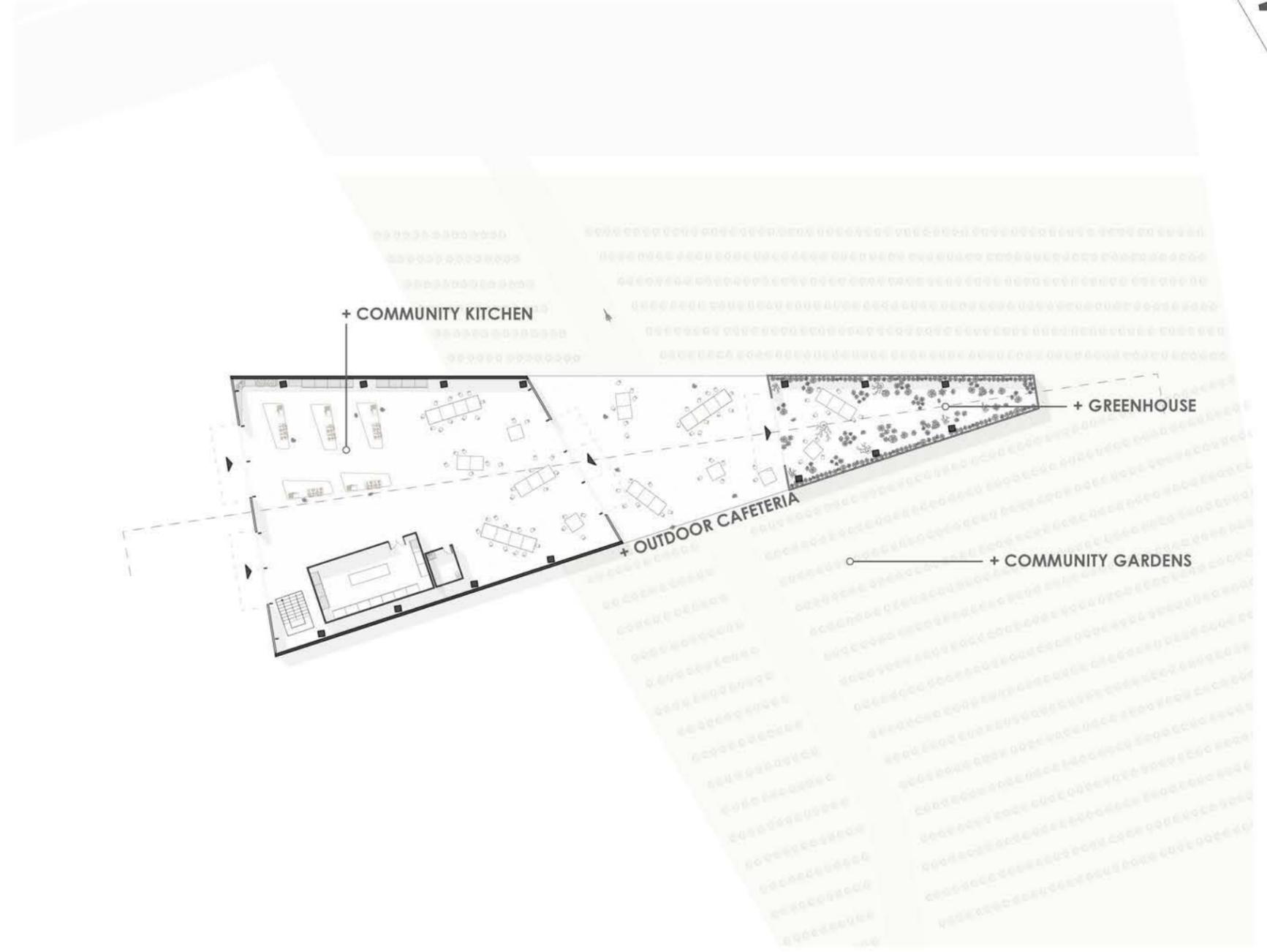
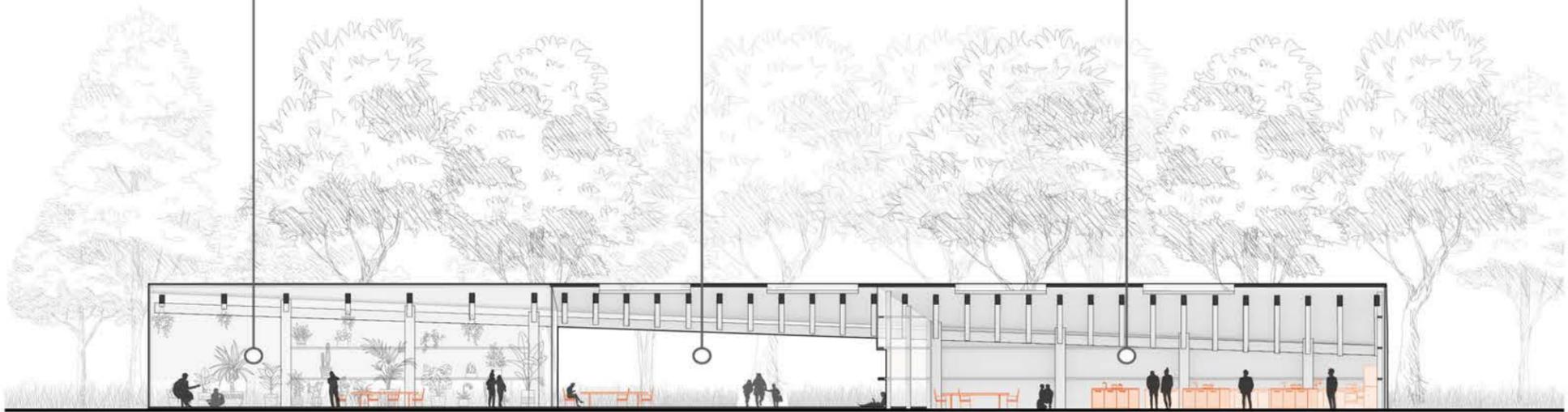


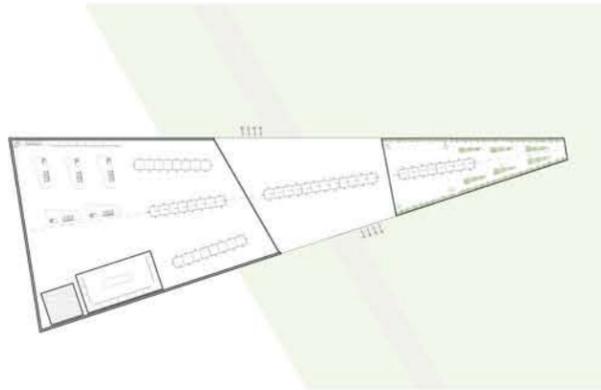
