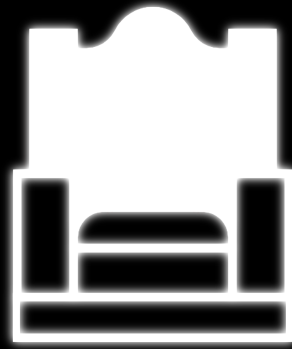

THE CREED:

“IT’S JUST THE WORD & I AND NO.1 ELSE”

Below is the introduction to the Creed "**It's Just The Word & I and NO.1 Else**" for the One Man Monotheistic System.
