English Section

- 1. C – The story states Rowan is fifteen.
- 2. C – She lives with Gran Isla in the keeper's cottage.
- 3. D – The causeway is reachable on foot "for only a few hours each day."
- 4 B – Engineers plan to remove the old Fresnel lens.
- 5 B – The logbook is titled "Keeper's Private Notes: Eamon Tamsin."
- 6 B – Eamon describes a "third tide," a short slack between flood and ebb.
- 7 B – The text names "Marshall chronometer, No. 27."
- 8 C – She sends "one long, two short," matching her father's code.
- 9 B – The never-cool kettle suggests constant hospitality and activity.
- 10 C – The gesture reads as reverent/protective, not functional.
- 11 B – Hiding a private log likely protects it from officials or theft.
- 12 B – Her tone ("The barge can't wait for sentiment") prioritises schedule and

safety procedure.

- 13 C – Rowan relies on her father's recorded judgement in a storm.

- 16 B – They share tea and delay removal: a move toward mutual respect/co-operation.
- 17 B – "Glassy" here = smooth/reflective, not literally glass.
- 18 B – "Ornamental" means decorative rather than functional.
- 19 B – "Tapped" expresses an action, so it's a verb.
- 20 C – "Mournful" describes "note," so it's an adjective.
- 21 C – "Maintanance" → maintenance.
- 22 E – No spelling error: briefing, concise, guidance, inexperienced are correct.
- 23 C – "Unpredictible" → unpredictable.
- 24 D – "Lense" → lens.
- 25 D – "Coroborate" → corroborate.
- 26 A – A comma is needed after the introductory clause: "Because the weather worsened, the crew..."
- 27 B – Missing comma after the reporting verb: "Ms Armitage said, 'then come

ahead.'"

- 28 A– Independent clauses need separation: "The horn sounded, the sea stilled and..."
- 29 B – A comma is needed after the relative clause: "Rowan, who had memorised the diagrams, gave..."
- 30 E – No punctuation error: commas before "but" and "so" are acceptable here.
- 31 C – Storms show subtle changes.
- 32 B – A notice that "flapped" would be frayed, not pristine or sealed.
- 33 B – Thoughts settle into order.
- 34 C – A careful decision is a judgement.
- 35 B – Responsibility would rest with her.

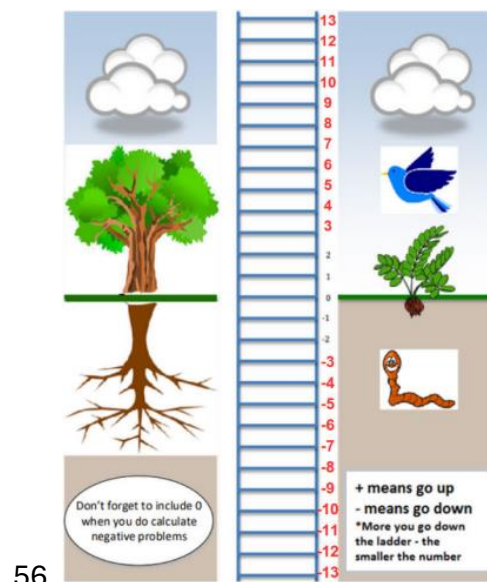
