Cigonyes centric world





But who are *cigonyes*?

Cigonyes build large, hybrid nests using both natural and urban materials. They choose elevated structures, return persistently to the same spots, and inadvertently redesign the city. Their behaviours highlight a non-human agency within the urban environment.

Plaça de la Palmera

The starting point of our project, Plaça de la Palmera hosts a human-made structure that now contains a large nest built by pigeons and parrots. This site shows how non-humans continuously adapt to human constructions, reshaping them for their own survival.
