Each section introduces one of the PUNX – Peri, Ex, Quest, and Curly – along with fun, easy-to-understand explanations and activities.

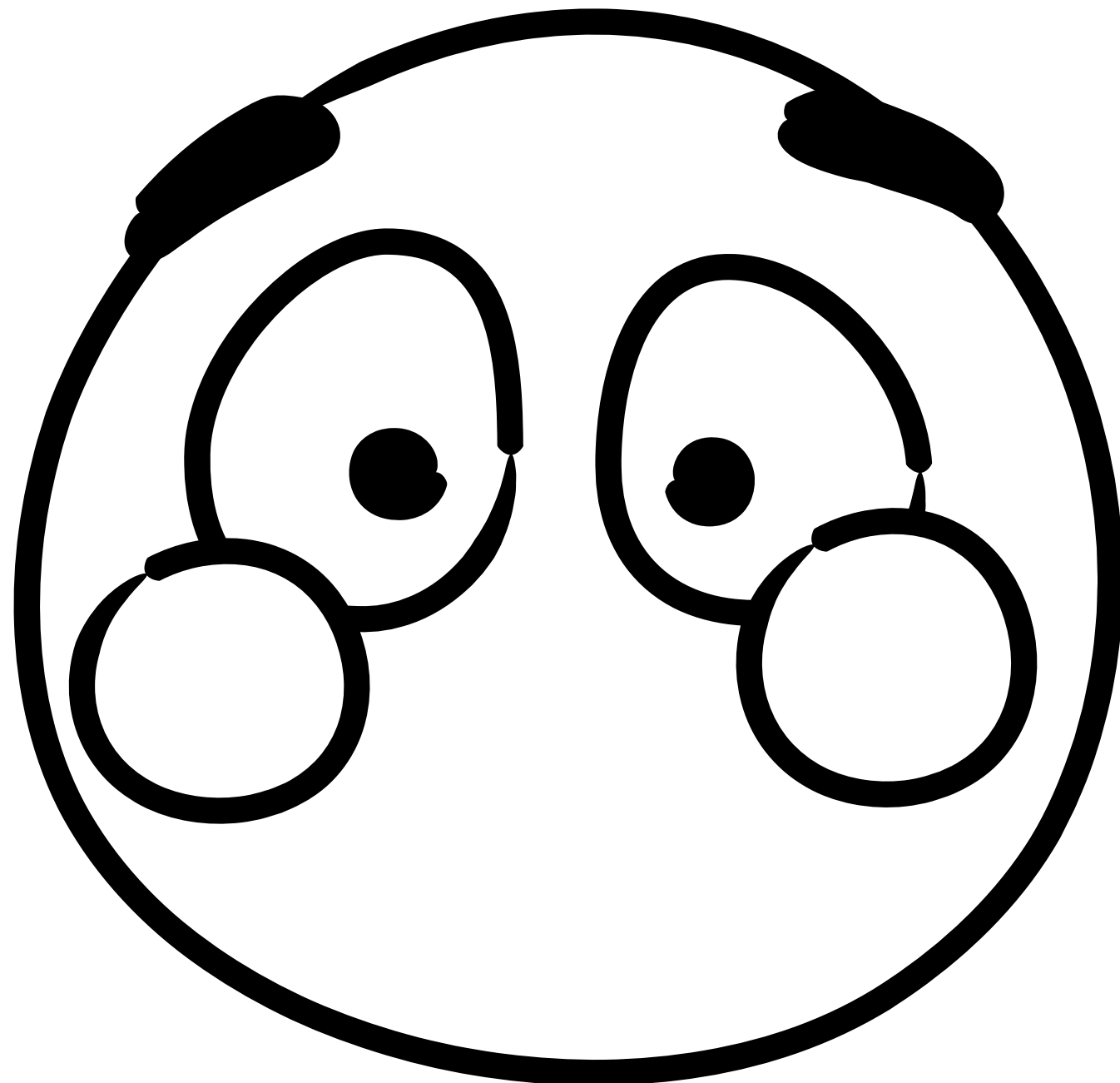
Children will have the opportunity to trace, cut, paste, and draw each punctuation mark, allowing children to internalize punctuation rules while practicing them in different contexts.

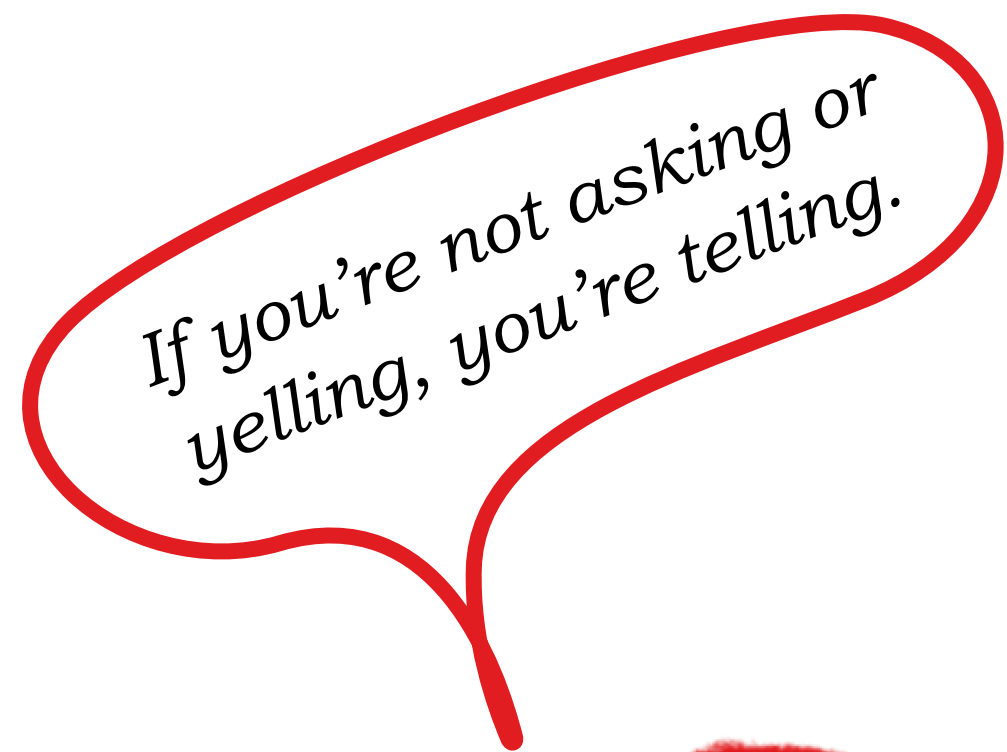

Use Peri when you'd like to STOP a sentence. Peri helps to complete thoughts.






