Executive Summary	
<p>The Courtyard SLT and governors made an executive decision to allocate Pupil Premium funding received by the school to a range of educational and social development areas to best benefit the students who were eligible for Free School Meals.</p> <p>The aim of the strategic allocation of additional funding is to support the development and progress of all students whilst reducing the gap between the achievements of disadvantaged students and their peers. It is recognised that students with ASC and a complexity of other needs, have significant difficulty in accessing the curriculum and making progress. Any needs regarding social, emotional and mental health need to be acknowledged and supported in order for the young person to access their learning and achieve their potential.</p> <p>The Courtyard SLT and governors allocate a significant percentage of Pupil Premium funding to CAMHS, Speech and Language and Counselling support within the school. Through a range of interventions, staff training and team teaching, all external services can support the development of the health and wellbeing of all students. The progress achieved by FSM students can be measured against their Appendix A targets.</p> <p>A proportion of funding is allocated to direct tutoring in order for Pupil Premium students to make maximum progress in their academic studies. Students are receiving an additional 34 hours of tutoring to support achievement.</p>	

Last year (2022-2023): 81% of PP pupils made expected or more than expected progress compared to 80% of non-PP pupils in English.
82% of PP pupils made expected or more than expected progress compared to 80% of non-PP pupils in Maths.
