## Punctuation

### 127 Answer B

Error: This is a run-on sentence. The two independent clauses ("I can't believe you're doing this" and "There are much better solutions to this problem") are joined together without proper punctuation.

Correction: I can't believe you're doing this. There are much better solutions to this problem. (A period is needed to separate the two complete thoughts).

### 128 Answer C

Error: The semicolon is used incorrectly. A semicolon should separate two independent clauses, but "growing larger and larger" is a dependent phrase, not a complete sentence. A comma should be used instead to set off the descriptive phrase.

Correction: The rain cloud gradually covered the entire town, growing larger and larger.

### 129 Answer: A

Error: The word "shed" is missing an apostrophe. It should be the contraction "she'd" for "she would".  
Correction: I think she'd rather not get involved...

### 130. Answer: B

Error: Because "Edgar" is a nonessential appositive, it just renames "the boys' father" and can be removed without changing the core meaning—it must be set off with commas on both sides:

The boys' father, Edgar, was known...

131. answer: C needs a comma or a full stop inside the closed quotation marks.

### 132. Answer: B

Error: The conjunctive adverb "Nevertheless" should be followed by a comma when it starts a sentence and connects back to the previous one.  
Correction: ...Nevertheless, he was content with his performance.

### 133. Mistake in D: Incorrect capitalization.

"Town" is a common noun and should not be capitalized unless it's part of a proper name.

### 134. Mistake in C: Incorrect capitalization.

"River" is a common noun and should not be capitalized unless it's part of a proper name.

### 135. Mistake in B: A full stop is needed after "airport".

136. Mistake in D: Incorrect capitalization. "australia" is a proper noun and must be capitalized.

### 137. B missing comma after (he was a teacher)

138. Mistake in C: Missing comma. A comma is needed after the introductory clause ("...last Christmas").

139. No mistake (E): The sentence is correctly punctuated.

### 140. Mistake in D: Incorrect use of a semicolon.

141. Mistake in C: Missing apostrophe. "couldn't" is a contraction of "could not" and should be written as "couldn't".

A colon should be used to introduce the list of people.

141. Mistake in C: Missing apostrophe. "couldn't" is a contraction of "could not" and should be written as "couldn't".
