

Sport Processes and Criteria Information Sheet

Overall Champion Boy/Girl Points Allocation:

Overall Runner-up and Champion boy/girl are awarded to the students in years 4-6 who score the highest number of points across all Coolbinia House sporting events throughout the year (not including Interschool Events). They will be awarded with a trophy at assembly at the end of the year. The events included in the points allocation are:

Year 4: 50m backstroke, 50m Freestyle, 50m Breaststroke, Cross Country, Javelin Throw, Long Jump, 400m sprint, 200m sprint, 80m sprint.

Year 5: 50m Backstroke, 100m Freestyle, 50m Freestyle, 50m Breaststroke, 25m Butterfly, Cross Country, Javelin Throw, Long Jump, Triple Jump, 400m sprint, 200m sprint, 80m sprint.

Year 6: 50m Backstroke, 100m Freestyle, 50m Freestyle, 50m Breaststroke, 50m Butterfly, Cross Country, Javelin Throw, Long Jump, Triple Jump, 400m sprint, 200m sprint, 80m sprint.

Swimming Champion Boy/Girl Points Allocation:

Swimming Runner-up and Champion boy/girl are awarded to the students in years 4-6 who score the highest number of points at the Coolbinia House Swimming Carnival. They will be awarded with a medallion at the conclusion of the carnival. The events included in the points allocation are:

Year 4: 50m Backstroke, 50m Freestyle, 50m Breaststroke

Year 5: 50m Backstroke, 100m Freestyle, 50m Freestyle, 50m Breaststroke, 25m Butterfly

Year 6: 50m Backstroke, 100m Freestyle, 50m Freestyle, 50m Breaststroke, 50m Butterfly

The following points are allocated to the top 8 finishers:

1st = 8 points, 2nd = 5 points, 3rd = 3 points, 4th = 2 points, 5th – 8th = 1 point

In the case of a tie, the highest number of points are awarded to both competitors. For example, 1st = 8 points, two competitors come = 2nd means both competitors come 2nd and score 5 points each, followed by the 4th place competitor scoring 2 points.

Interschool Swimming Selection:

Interschool swimming selection is directly based off the times and results scored at the Coolbinia House Swimming Carnival. We compete at the State Schools Primary Schools Swimming Carnival.

Athletics Champion Boy/Girl Points Allocation:

The Athletics Runner-up and Champion boy/girl are awarded to the students in years 1-6 who score the highest number of points, based on their times run and distances measured, across the Athletics events below (not including Interschool Events). They will be awarded with a medallion at the conclusion of the Coolbinia House Athletics Carnival.

Year 1: Cross Country, Vortex Throw, Long Jump, 50 sprint

Year 2: Cross Country, Vortex Throw, Long Jump, 50m sprint

Year 3: Cross Country, Javelin Throw, Long Jump, 400m sprint, 200m sprint, 80m sprint.

Year 4: Cross Country, Javelin Throw, Long Jump, 400m sprint, 200m sprint, 80m sprint.

Year 5: Cross Country, Javelin Throw, Long Jump, Triple Jump, 400m sprint, 200m sprint, 80m sprint.

Year 6: Cross Country, Javelin Throw, Long Jump, Triple Jump, 400m sprint, 200m sprint, 80m sprint.

House Cross-Country:

All Coolbinia Students from Kindy to Year 6 will compete in the House Cross Country Carnival. These points awarded go toward each Houses total points scored and the Year 1-6 Athletics Champion boy/girl award. The Runner-up and Champion boy/girl winners and Champion House will be announced at the conclusion of the Coolbinia House Athletics Carnival. The following points are allocated to the top 8 finishers:

1st = 8 points, 2nd = 5 points, 3rd = 3 points, 4th = 2 points, 5th – 8th = 1 point

In the case of a tie, the highest number of points are awarded to both competitors. For example, 1st = 8 points, two competitors come = 2nd means both competitors come 2nd and score 5 points each, followed by the 4th place competitor scoring 2 points.

Interschool X-Country selection:

Interschool X-Country selection is directly based off the results and times recorded by the students at the Coolbinia House Cross Country Carnival. Only under circumstances that are out of the ordinary will students' times during Cross Country training sessions prior to the carnival be taken into consideration for Interschool selection. This decision will be made by the Specialist Physical Education teacher and the School Principal.

House Jumps and Throws Selection:

House Jumps and Throws Selection is based off the students results recorded during trials undertaken in Physical Education lessons, Senior Sport (years 4-6) and morning fitness. Only the top 8 competitors in each gender, the top two from each House, will compete in each event. For example, the 2 top males/females from Charlesworth, Martin, Aitken, and Lewis make up the top 8 competitors. The third placed competitor in each house, in each event will be the reserve. Jumps and Throws includes the following events:

Year 1 and 2: Long Jump and Vortex Throw

Year 3 and 4: Long Jump and Javelin Throw (300g)

Year 5 and 6: Long Jump, Triple Jump and Javelin Throw (400g)

The following points are allocated to the top 8 finishers and go toward each Houses total points scored and the year 1-6 Athletics Champion Boy/Girl award. The Runner-up and Champion boy/girl winners and Champion House will be announced at the conclusion of the Coolbinia House Athletics Carnival:

1st = 8 points, 2nd = 5 points, 3rd = 3 points, 4th = 2 points, 5th – 8th = 1 point

In the case of a tie, the highest number of points are awarded to both competitors. For example, 1st = 8 points, two competitors come = 2nd means both competitors come 2nd and score 5 points each, followed by the 4th place competitor scoring 2 points.

House Athletics Track Events Selection:

Track Events and division selection is based off the times run by the students during trials undertaken in Physical Education classes and the places run by the students during Senior Sport (year 4-6) and morning fitness. Only under circumstances that are out of the ordinary will students' previous year's results be taken in consideration for event

and division selection. This decision will be made by the Specialist Physical Education teacher and the School Principal. These events include:

Kindergarten – Year 2: 50m sprint

Years 3 and 4: 400m sprint, 200m sprint and 80m sprint

Year 5 and 6: 400m sprint, 200m sprint and 100m sprint

The following points are allocated to the students in each division. The points scored, based on their times run and distances measured, go toward each Houses total points scored and the year 1-6 Athletics Champion Boy/Girl award. The Runner-up and Champion boy/girl winners and Champion House will be announced at the conclusion of the Coolbinia House Athletics Carnival:

Division A: 1st = 8 points, 2nd = 5 points, 3rd = 3 points, 4th = 2 points, 5th – 8th = 1 point

Division B: 1st = 5 points, 2nd = 3 points, 3rd = 2 points, 4th – 8th = 1 point

Division C: 1st = 3 points, 2nd = 2 points, 3rd – 8th = 1 point

Division D: 1st = 2 points, 2nd – 8th = 1 point

In the case of a tie, the highest number of points are awarded to both competitors. For example, 1st = 8 points, two competitors come = 2nd means both competitors come 2nd and score 5 points each, followed by the 4th place competitor scoring 2 points.

House Team Games Selection:

Due to the number of students at the school, two teams are created for each team game. The aim for Team 1 and Team 2 is to create them of equal ability with a focus on student participation, enjoyment, and competitiveness. These teams are created by the year level classroom teachers during morning fitness and Senior Sport (year 4-6). These teams are looked over by the Specialist Physical Education teacher to ensure equity of ability between Team 1 and Team 2. Changes to the teams may be required on the day due to absent or injured students. The events included in the Team Games are:

Pre-Primary: Flag Race and River-Rock

Years 1-2: Flag Race, River-Rock, Passball and Junior Leaderball

Years 3-6: Flag Race, River-Rock, Passball and Senior Leaderball

The following points are allocated to each House based on Team 1 and Team 2's result in years 1-6:

1st = 20 points, 2nd = 15 points, 3rd = 10 points, 4th = 5 points

Relay Selection:

Two competitors from each House and gender will compete in the 4x50/80/100m mixed relays, based on their times run in the races. For example, in the 4x100m relay the two year 6 male and female competitors in each House run. The next fastest runner will take the place as the reserve in the case of one of the fastest two runners getting injured.

The following points are allocated to each House:

1st = 20 points, 2nd = 15 points, 3rd = 10 points, 4th = 5 points

Grand Relay Selection:

Only the fastest male and female results from each House and year level on the Athletics Carnival Day are selected to compete in the Grand Relay. For example, the fastest year 1 male and female from Lewis, Martin, Charlesworth, and Aitken will compete.

The following points are allocated to each House:

1st = 20 points, 2nd = 15 points, 3rd = 10 points, 4th = 5 points

Interschool Jumps and Throws Selection:

Interschool Jumps and Throws selection is based off the results recorded by the students at the Coolbinia Jumps and Throws Carnival. Only under circumstances that are out of the ordinary will students' results recorded during Physical Education lessons under the supervision of the Physical Education teacher and the School Principal will be taken into consideration for Interschool selection. This decision will be made by the Specialist Physical Education teacher and the School Principal.

Interschool Athletics Selection:

Interschool Athletics selection is based off the results recorded by the students at the Coolbinia House Athletics Carnival. Only under circumstances that are out of the ordinary will students' results recorded during Physical Education lessons under the supervision of the Physical Education teacher and the School Principal will be taken into consideration for Interschool selection. This decision will be made by the Specialist Physical Education teacher and the School Principal.
