Why we vote Pro-Life:

Men, human traffickers, and sexual predators, can get the abortion pill through online providers. They are fraudulently posing as pregnant women to get the mail-order abortion pill, then forcing or tricking women into taking the abortion drugs.

Indiana legislators must act in the upcoming session to hold abortion drug traffickers accountable for their illegal activity in Indiana. Voters hold the power to protect innocent, pre-born children. 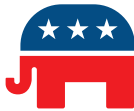
