		Unsanitary room with filth, spoiled food or garbage
		Pest problems (rats, mice, spiders, bed bugs, cockroach and other insect infestations)
		Accumulation of personal belongings covering all floor space and stockpiled over 4
		feet, making bed inaccessible and unusable
		Excessive storage blocking windows, sinks, bathrooms, entry door way or pathway
		Flammable items stored near heaters, stoves or radiator heaters
		Exposed electrical wiring, leaking and clogged plumbing
		No clearance near electrical outlets or overloaded electrical outlet
		Any unsanitary condition or nuisance injurious to health
		Conditions that may cause fires—such as accumulation of newspapers or clothes
		S.F. Fire Code Section 315.2.1
		Combustible material stored less than 2 feet below a ceiling in non-sprinklered areas of building
		Combustible material stored less than 18 inches below sprinkler head deflectors on ceiling in sprinklered areas of building
