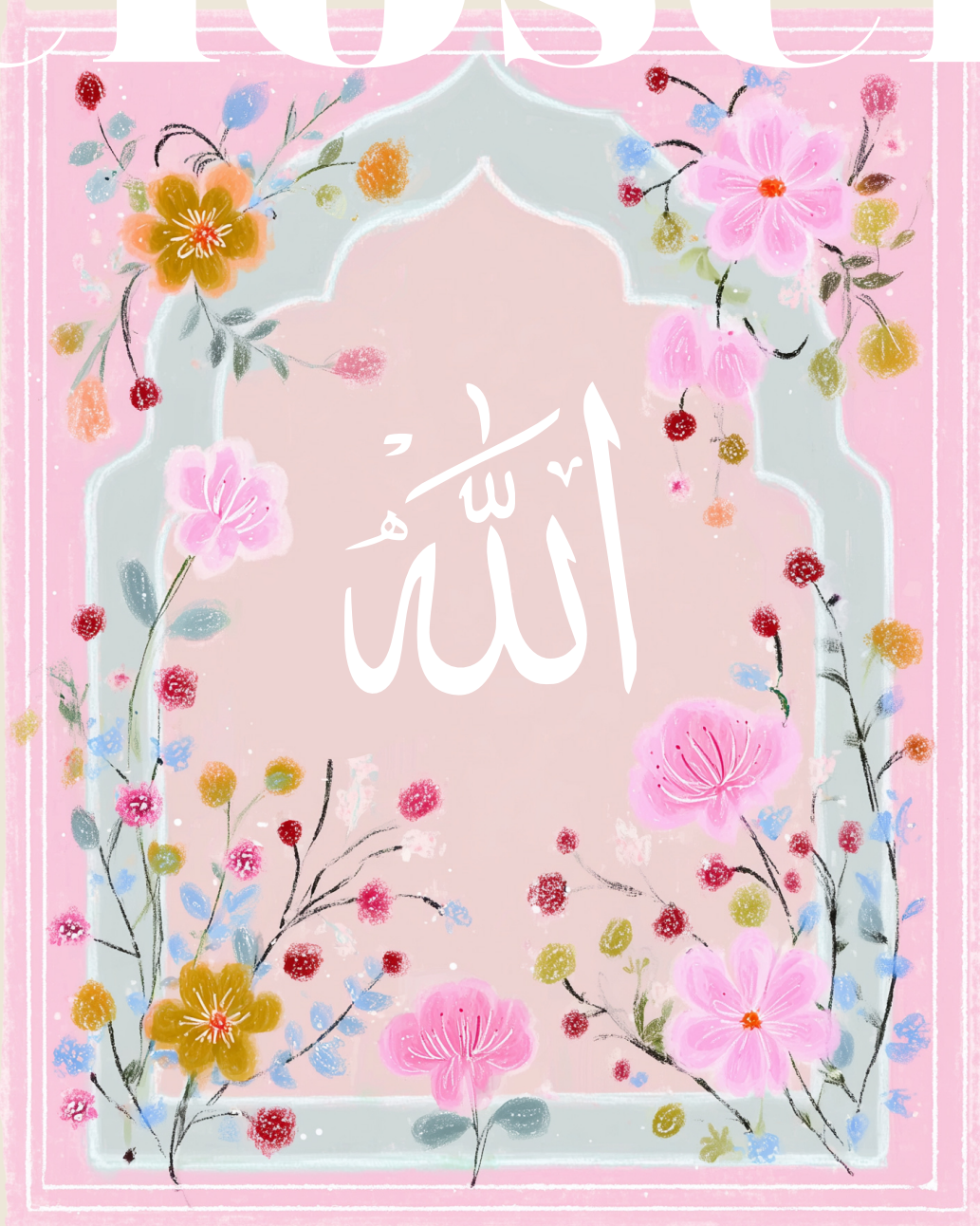

And just like that, the first week of Ramadan has come and gone. At this point, for many of us, we have gotten used to a certain Ramadan Rhythm - Sahur before dawn, Tahajjud in the quiet, Taraweeh that is a rest for the soul, Qur'an Sessions, the Iftar + Maghrib + Isha' rush, then back to Sahur all over again!

At present, I am running on 3-4 hours of sleep every night, and every time I get out of bed the next day, I remind myself that **everything is happening because of Allah SWT.**

Allah SWT must remain at the centre and the core of our being - *not as a side note, but the very reason everything is happening.*

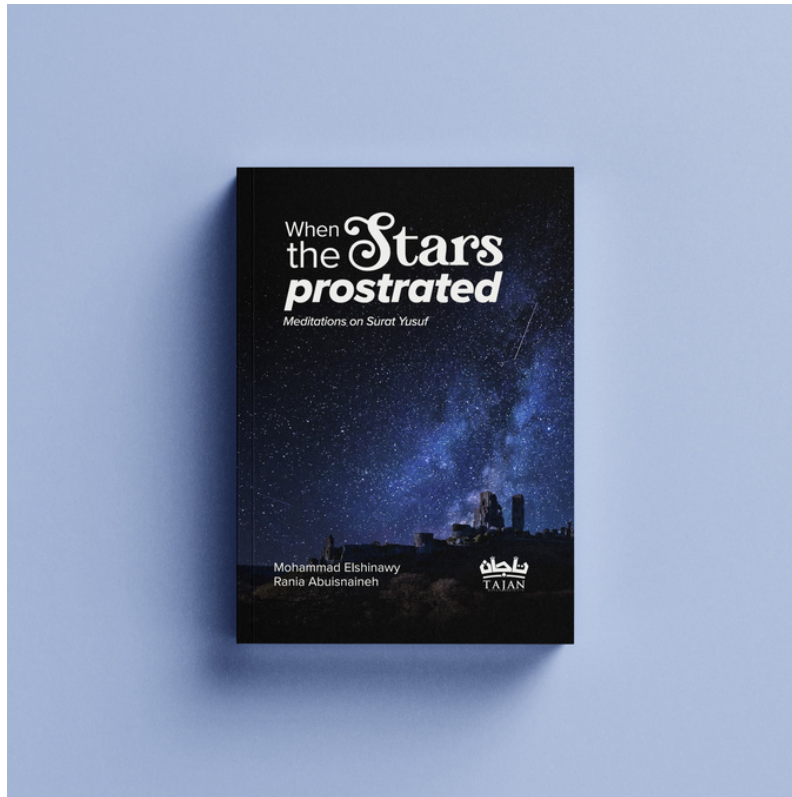
Rasulullah ﷺ said in the famous Hadith Jibril: "Worship Allah as if you see Him, and if you cannot, ***then know that He sees you.***"

 **Ustazah 'Alima** 🌞

1) Narrated Muhammad bin Ka'b Al-Qurazi:
"I heard 'Abdullah bin Mas'ud saying: 'The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said: "[Whoever recites a letter] from Allah's Book, then he receives the reward from it, and the reward of ten the like of it. I do not say that Alif Lam Mim is a letter, but Alif is a letter, Lam is a letter and Mim is a letter."

19 letters x 10 hasanat = 190 hasanat

2) hadith "If someone draws near to God during it with some good act he will be like one who fulfills an obligatory duty in another month, and he who fulfills an obligatory duty in it will be like one who fulfills seventy obligatory duties in another month. "

So assuming you read the basmalah in fard prayer, that would be

190 × 70 = 13 300

3) Laylatul qadr is better than 1000 months

So basmalah (quran) in fard solah would carry **at least:**

$13300 \times (1000 \times 30 \text{ days}) = \mathbf{399\ 000\ 000}$ hasanat from just that basmalah alone

AT LEAST coz Allah says BETTER than a thousand month.

Remember all the points mentioned above are still the LEAST! Allah can multiply way more than 10! Way more than 70! Way more than 1000 months!!!

(ok bye, crying in a corner .. 🥹)
